### Lord, Hear Our Prayer Intercessory Prayer at St. Aloysius Parish

In times of crisis and anxiety, in times of joy and celebration, we may become especially aware of the power of God's abundant mercy and grace. The Catechism of the Catholic Church reminds us of the New Testament's rich descriptions of calling out to God in times of need: We ask, beseech, plead, invoke, entreat, cry out, even "struggle in prayer." (CCC 2629). Indeed, every "joy and suffering, every event and need can become the matter for thanksgiving" to God (CCC 2648).

In Hebrews we are taught that Christ Jesus is our heavenly High Priest who "lives to make intercession" for those who draw near to God (7:25). St. Paul reminds the Romans that the Holy Spirit "himself intercedes for us... according to the will of God" (8:26-27) and instructs St. Timothy that all Christians are to share in this ministry of intercessory prayer: praying "for all men, for kings and all who are in high positions," for persecutors, and those who reject the Gospel (1 Tm 2:1).

At St. Aloysius, there are several established ways to ask for prayer. Requests for intercession may be emailed to prayerline@staloysiusparish.com or given to the receptionist in the parish office by calling 343-6657. These requests are shared with Deacon Chauvin Wilkinson and a team of intercessors.

Requests for prayer may also be written in the Petition Book located near the Tabernacle in the Church. Those who spend time in prayer before the Blessed Sacrament in the Tabernacle are encouraged to consult the entries and offer intercessions for the concerns and joys they find recorded there.

Finally, remember to ask the help of our heavenly intercessors – the Blessed Virgin Mary, our patron St. Aloysius, and all the holy men and women throughout the ages who now surround the throne of God in unceasing prayer and adoration.

### Golf Classic promotes fellowship, charity

Parishioners dusted off their clubs and headed to University Club on Monday, March 18. Upon their arrival, they were greeted with a dozen St. Aloysius golf balls, many of which found their home in the hazards of the long, challenging course. After checking in and while lunch was being served, some ventured over to the putting green and driving range to practice.

All returned to gather for prayer ahead of the noon shotgun start. Father Eddie was present to invite the Holy Spirit into the moment with a prayer and a heart-warming blessing of the players and their families, as Father Randy was called to preside over a funeral inside the church.

A light-hearted awards banquet was held after the windy round of golf, and it was the raffle drawing for a trip to Augusta National to see the 2020 Masters Golf Tournament that garnered the most attention.

The 2019 Golf Classic, tournament and raffle together raised almost \$14,000 for the parish. In addition, \$645 was raised out on the course for the Myles Smith Scholarship Endowment at the School.

Randy Cangelosi, in his final year as Golf Classic chairman, remembers a tournament that included about 10 teams and 35-40 golfers in the mid-2000s — raising about \$4,000 — to the one now that consists of 30-35 teams and **Page 4, June 2019, ALOYSIUS ALIVE** 

120-140 golfers.

Randy credits the increase in fundraising to the generosity of golfers, sponsors and donors

— like Pat Quigley behind the Masters Raffle and the increase in participation to the mindset of volunteers asking "how can we help" instead of "why." He said ministry co-chairman Bradley Gremillion and Ross Berthelot supported the effort the last four years and were influential in growing the Administration Commission ministry. Overall, Randy says it is special enjoying the outdoors, our shared faith and the sport of golf with fellow parishioners.

The Golf Classic is one of three annual fundraisers for the parish and typically takes place in March. Like the Parish Fair and Auction in 2018-19, 100% of its proceeds are dedicated to the capital projects of the master plan.

Monday, March 16 has been reserved for the 2020 Golf Classic. ### New Stephen Ministers commissioned; program active in parish since '13

Stephen Ministry leaders Bob Schoen, Kathy Nikolaus and Marie Hebert recently completed four months of training for three new Stephen Ministers. Dana Territo, Keith Colvin, and Ann Ourso were commissioned to serve as Stephen Ministers at the 9 a.m. Liturgy on Sunday, May 19 by Father Eddie Martin.

Dana is very active with the Alzheimers Association and writes a weekly article on alzheimers in The Advocate. Keith, who recently moved back to Baton Rouge, was actively involved in hospice volunteer work while living in New Orleans. Ann was interested in Stephen Ministry for some time, but, because of other obligations she didn't feel she had the time to commit until recently.

Three of our current Stephen Ministers were present for the commissioning: Jane Roussel, Helen Bullock and V.J. Dauterive. With the commissioning of our new members, we now total 12 active Stephen Ministers in St. Aloysius Parish prepared to walk with anyone struggling through a difficult time. Stephen Ministers not pictured are Lynn Carville, Laura Lee Owen and Leslie Chauvin.

Stephen Ministry has been active in St. Aloysius Parish since 2013. It was introduced by a parishioner, Ann Sperry, who had moved to the Baton Rouge area from New York and had recognized the positive impact the program had on parishioners in her previous parish. She was instrumental in introducing Stephen Ministry to St. Aloysius Parish with the permission of Father Than Vu.

St. Luke's and St. James Episcopal Churches in Baton Rouge, who have active Stephen Ministry in their parishes for over 15 years, participated in an introductory presentation to our parish. As a result of that presentation, four St. Aloysius Parishioners signed up to attend an intensive weeklong training to become Stephen Ministry leaders.

Twenty-three Stephen Ministers have been trained since 2013. When trained, a Stephen Minister commits to two years in the ministry, or he/ she can serve as long as he/she desires. We have provided confidential Christian care to 23 parishioners. The Christian care to an individual may last from a few weeks to a few years, depending on the need of the person receiving the Christian care.

Marie Hebert is the only remaining original Stephen Minister leader. The other three have moved out of the Baton Rouge area. Bob Schoen attended Stephen Leader training in 2014 and Kathy Nikolaus in 2015. They have been very instrumental in helping Marie keep the ministry active.

The Stephen leaders have committed to train every year as long as there are parishioners expressing an interest to serve in the ministry. It is a 50-hour program spread over 12 to



14 weeks, beginning the first week in January. The training includes topics such as Distinctively Christian caring, Confidentiality, Active Listening, Learning to set boundaries, Experiencing Grief, Feelings, Understanding Sympathy verses Empathy, to name a few of the 18 subjects.

Most Blessed Sacrament in Baton Rouge also has a very active Stephen Ministry, as well as St. Ann's Parish in Napoleonville. A St. George parishioner has recently requested information about the ministry and our Stephen leaders will be offering an introductory meeting to that parish.

Stephen Ministry is interdenominational. It was started in 1974 by Dr. Kenneth Haugk, a Lutheran pastor and clinical psychologist, when he realized he could not keep up with the needs of his parishioners who were experiencing losses or dramatic changes in their lives. You can log on to https://www.stephenministries.org to read more of the history of the organization. The ministry draws its name from St. Stephen. In the book of Acts, Chapter 6, Stephen was chosen to provide caring ministry to those in need. Jesus provided the example to us as a Christian community to care for others starting in our faith community.

As we experience more shortages of priests in our parishes, it's becoming increasingly evident that our priests also need help in serving parishioners in their time of need. Our ministry works very closely with Father Randy and Father Eddie. The ministry does not provide counseling, so if someone is in need of that service they are not referred to Stephen Ministry. Stephen Ministry is there for someone journeying through a difficult situation or life change. If it becomes evident during the course of ministering that counseling is needed, that is discussed with the person and a referral is made to someone of the person's choice.

No one knows if a person has a Stephen Minister unless the person receiving the care reveals it. Stephen Ministers meet twice a month for supervision. Even the fellow Stephen Ministers do not know who is receiving care because names are never mentioned. The purpose of supervision is to make sure the Stephen Minister is remaining process oriented as the training requires. As Stephen Ministers we are trained to allow God to work through us in our caring. We provide the care – He provides to cure.
