sings the name of the staff member he needs next in a loud baritone.

He'll be the first to tell you, while filling his coffee mug in the break room, that he has an unfortunate habit of unintentionally finishing the coffee carafe. And you can offer to make the

genuinely loves spending time with the high school juniors preparing for confirmation and saying Mass anywhere and anyhow.

Tim Staples, the director of apologetics and evangelization at Catholic Answers, told those gathered at the 2019 Men of the Immaculata Conference that he left seminary because he lacked a calling to say Mass and hear confession. We lay people likely think our priests struggle with Mass and confession because we do. I've certainly had that mentality, especially since my boys arrived on the scene. And it is amazingly heartening to see our pastor offer

to say extra Masses because he genuinely loves saying Mass and being with his parishioners.

Father Randy recently offered to say 9:30 a.m. Masses, in addition to the 8 a.m. Masses, on Fridays that our school hosted Grandparents' Day. Purely because he wanted Mass to be a part of that celebration and knew the timing of 8 a.m. Mass made it hard for the school, parents, grandparents, and carpool. (Oh, carpool. To what can I compare you?)

On our recent staff retreat, Father Randy was more than happy to tote ice chests, bottled water, and any supplies I needed help with in his white SUV. But first he had to drop off the rectory lawnmower, which he repaired on his day off with the help of videos on YouTube.


BAPTISM: Please contact the Parish Office during early months of pregnancy. Baptismal preparation is required.

## SAS parents hear from state experts about cyber safety

On Sept. 18, more than 100 parents of fourth- through eighth-grade St. Aloysius School students received on-campus cyber safety training from the Louisiana Department of Justice.

Presented by the St. Aloysius Parent Education Committee, the event featured Corey Bourgeois with Attorney General Jeff Landry's Cyber Crime Unit, who offered practical tips for managing students' digital screen time and for avoiding risky cell-phone apps, cyber predators and fatal cases of cyber bullying.

He also described ways unsupervised children have unintentionally violated state laws or have been extorted by adults who pose as young children. "You teach children how to be responsible with technology," Bourgeois said. "You can't just hand them a phone and say don't bother me."

Bourgeois advised parents to learn all passwords for their children's phone apps. He recommended websites like www. commonsensemedia.org, where parents can keep up to date on such risky apps as Tik Tok, Vault and House Party. He also encouraged parents to explore apps like Disney Circle to limit digital screen time and schedule family time instead.

Parents should also teach their children to keep Instagram and other app settings on private and disable location sharing; avoid communicating with or accepting friend requests from strangers; and never say anything online that a student would not say face to face.

School guidance counselor Merritt Guercio described the importance of these precautions in "developing the whole child in the Catholic tradition," which includes the social skills students learn to interact with other people using technology. 

## Seventh-graders collect blue jeans to comfort others



### St. Aloysius School Honors Scott Lamana on 9/11/19

On the wall of the St. Aloysius School office, there is a flag in a display case. The framed certificate beneath it reads, "This is to certify that the accompanying flag was flown over the Pentagon on Nov. 1, 2012, for Lt. Michael Scott Lamana, in honor of the victims of 9/11." Scottie was at work in his office at the Pentagon on the morning of Sept. 11, 2001. He was killed when a jet was deliberately flown into his section of the complex.

Lt. Michael Scott "Scottie" Lamana graduated from St. Aloysius School in 1983. His family has always been very active in the life of the parish. His sisters, Andi and Dani, and nephews Brandon, Michael and Joseph Chatelain are also alumni of the school. It was a great honor for the school to receive the special flag from Scott's parents, Mike and Wanda Lamana. Every year, the school flies Scott's flag in honor of his sacrifice for our country.

On Sept. 11, the entire school gathered in the gym for a prayer service. Also present was Mike Lamana, Scott's father. The service was led by Father Eddie Martin and the 8th grade Advisory Board members, who served as an Honor Guard. Scott's flag was displayed on a special podium. The service included a prayer for all victims on the 9/11 attacks and their families, "The Prayer of St. Francis" and the "Morning Offering."

The student body then recited the "Pledge of Allegiance" and sang "God Bless America," led by members of the SAS choir. Principal Erin Candilora presented the flag to members of the Honor Guard, who processed out of the gym to the flagpole plaza, to the strains of the choir singing, "Mansions of the Lord." The rest of the 8th graders met them at the plaza to participate in a short service.

At the flagpole, Scott's flag was raised and then lowered to half-staff. The students recited the "Pledge of Allegiance" and the "Our Father." Father Eddie then offered a prayer for Scott, his family and the other individuals who lost their lives, or were injured on Sept. 11, 2001. Scott's flag remained waving in the breeze until the end of the school day. It was then placed back in its special place of honor in the St. Aloysius School office.

On Sept. 25, Father Randy blessed the new LIONS' STREAM Lab at St. Aloysius School. He began by praying for all students and teachers who will use the newly renovated space. Father Randy then blessed each of the walls with Holy Water.

This new space fosters learning in an innovative way for students to gain wisdom about the world God created for us through Science, Technology, Religion, Engineering, Art, and Math

The blessing was a moment filled with gratitude for the beautiful teaching space made possible by generous donations from the school's Annual Appeal.
