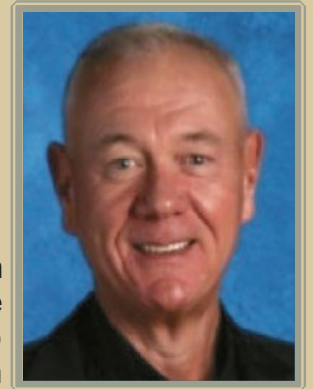

Our Challenge



Dear friends:

The story of the great flood in the Book of Genesis reflected God's judgment on the earth and lasted for forty days. Then Noah's faithfulness was honored by the sign of the rainbow, and he and his passengers went forth from the ark to replenish the earth. God's judgment is always followed by His redemption and an opportunity to begin again. The earliest Christians considered Noah's ark to be symbolic of the New Testament Church. In the first letter of St. Peter, he compared the flood to baptism. God's people are saved through the water, and their suffering and sacrifice are rewarded by their deliverance to higher ground. This weekend's gospel passage from St. Mark tells us that Jesus' experience in the wilderness involved both wild beasts and ministering angels. We, too, find ourselves living between worldly threats on one side and the providence of God on the other. We can withstand the presence of evil by trusting in the goodness of God. Jesus came preaching, but only AFTER his baptism and a long period of testing in the wilderness. His experience paralleled that of the Israelites who spent forty years in the wilderness before they were ready to enter the Promised Land. Whatever we would do for God or for other people deserves our best preparation and true dedication. We are naïve to expect that our faith will provide protection from suffering and other difficulties. We are not promised protection from the evils of life or the eventualities of our human condition, but we are assured of God's presence with us as we endure these trials. Rarely do we accomplish significant things by accident. Life's major victories and accomplishments usually come as the result of thorough preparation and serious dedication. Lent is a time when we become intentional about living our faith. The season of Lent provides an extended period for taking stock of our lives and renewing our vows of faithfulness and diligence.

St. Joseph's Day Altar March 18-19, 2024

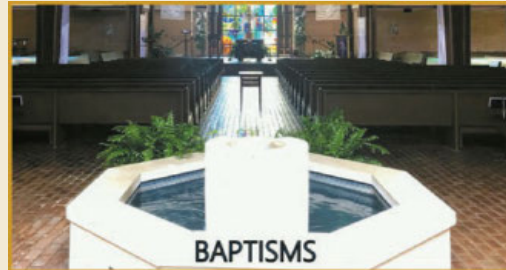
