CHILDREN'S CHURCH LOOKING FOR MINISTRY LEADERS AND VOLUNTEERS

Children's Church is a great opportunity for adults and middle school/high school youth to volunteer and help eager youngsters learn the Word of the Lord. Children's Church is an age-appropriate Liturgy of the Word offered for children in PreK through 2nd grade at most 9:00 AM and 11:00 AM Masses. No pre-registration is necessary. All children are welcome and encouraged to attend. Just before the Liturgy of the Word begins for the assembly, the celebrant will invite the children to gather at the altar, receive a blessing, and then follow the catechist from the church to the school cafeteria. During this special time, the volunteers will lead the children through prayers, songs and readings that are simplified for children. The children will learn about the same scripture readings as the rest of the assembly. They will be taught a simplified main message of the readings and are encouraged to share that message with their parents after Mass. The children will return to Mass to sit with their families just before the consecration. Ministry leaders and volunteers are needed to teach the lessons each week. Our Challenge

Dear friends,

Many people have dreamed of being granted one wish or request. In our first reading this weekend, we hear that it happened to King Solomon. He could have chosen a long life, immense wealth, or military success. Instead, he chose wisdom: "an understanding heart to govern your people and to distinguish right from wrong." He evidenced great wisdom in his choice, and God granted his request. Still writing to the earliest Christians in Rome in this weekend's second reading, St. Paul offers a profound understanding of how God is involved in our



lives, especially in our times of suffering. God does not cause everything that happens, but God is at work in whatever happens to us, seeking to use the experience to help us grow more fully into the image of Jesus Christ. Our culture's quantitative values place a premium on "how big" and "how much." Jesus put the emphasis on qualitative values, on quality of life. A true treasure, such as the kingdom of God, is worth sacrificing all the temporary, unfulfilling things the world thinks are so important. A popular television show a number of years ago was called "*I've Got a Secret*." The guest always had a secret and the panelists worked at guessing what it was. Some secrets remain unknown to us forever. Many of the mysteries of God confound us. Apparently, God is good at keeping secrets. A father questioned his son about an incident involving another boy in the neighborhood. The son asked, "*Dad, can you keep a secret?*" The father said, "*Yes, of course.*" The son said, "*So can I.*" We speak of God as the One to whom all hearts are open and all secrets are known. God knows all about us and loves us anyway. God's secrets are revealed to us in God's own time. Often God waits until we are mature enough or wise enough to be good stewards of his holy mysteries. Even then, beyond what we know of God and his eternal kingdom, there are mysteries and secrets we cannot begin to fathom.




Dear Fr. Randy & Parishioners, I write these few lines with an attitude of gratitude. Thank you for the kind hospitality you
