

Our Challenge

Dear friends:

In our passage this Sunday from the Book of Exodus, Moses prostrates himself. He addresses God as "Adonai" not as Yahweh. This gives heightened emphasis to God's holiness and transcendence. Moses, knowing that God forgives, asks for a reversal of God's expressed intention. And, the request is granted. In the second reading, Paul expressed hope that the earliest Church in Corinth would go forward



on to perfection, and that they would live in harmony and peace. He ends with a blessing and benediction of peace. The gospel this weekend emphasizes that the origin and initiative in all salvation lies with God. God gave us his only Son so that we all, the lovely and the unlovely, could know His grace and love. God acts not for His own sake but for all of our sakes. God is not like an absolute monarch who treats each person as a subject to be reduced to total obedience. God is the Father who cannot be happy until His wandering children have come home. God does not smash people into submission. He yearns for them to accept his grace and love. We are taught to live in faith but many wonder why our capacities for love, patience, and kindness are limited. But these qualities belong only to those who are growing in faith. Without God's grace and faith in God, all that we may possess is worth nothing. The goal that we seek of increasing our faith makes us worthy of God's promise to us. It is a task that calls for our dedication and our highest aspiration.






Cracked Pots: Blessed & Broken A personal loss support group





Prayer Shawl Ministry Volunteers


