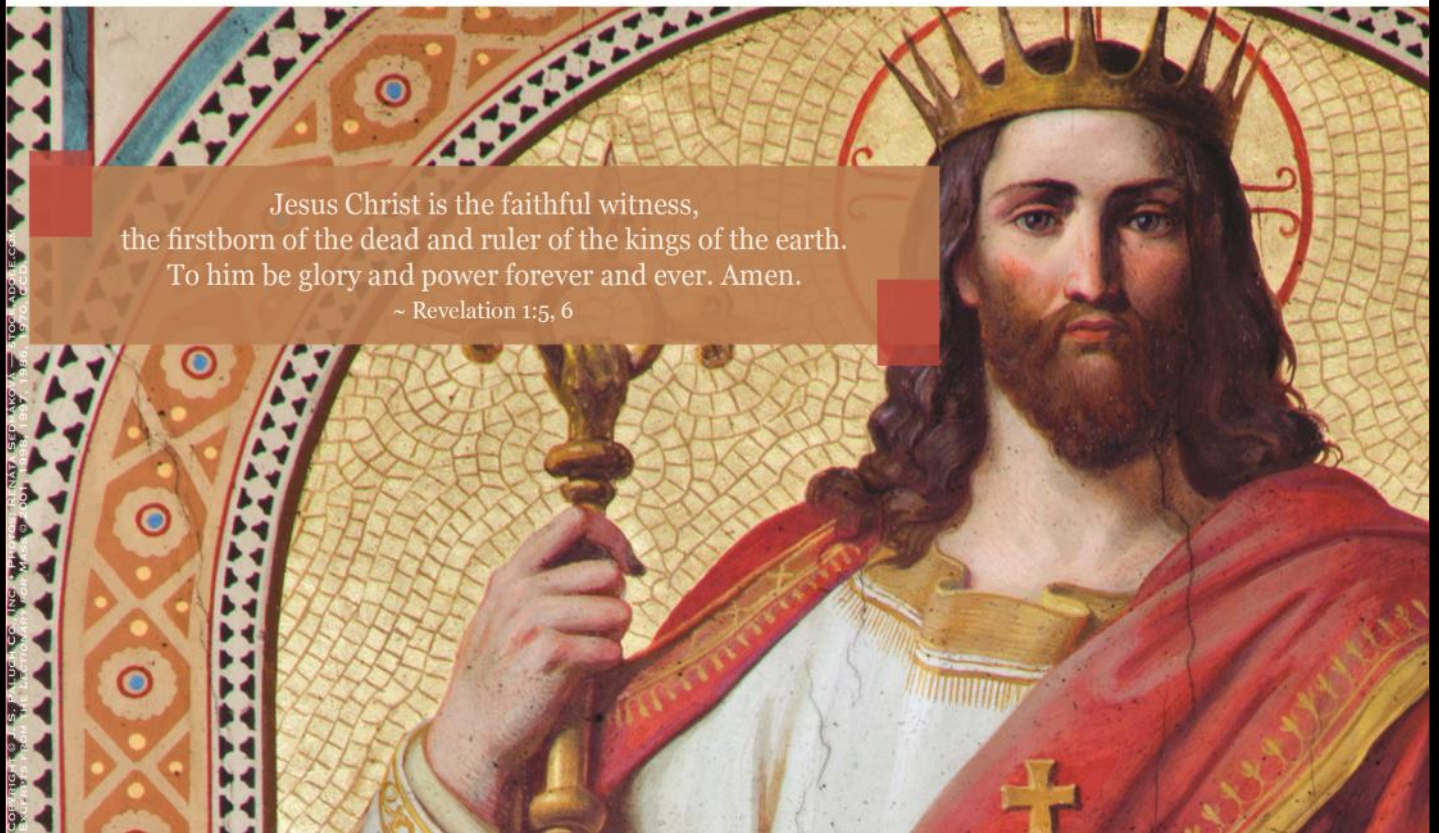

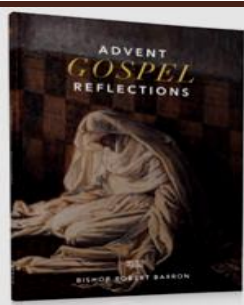

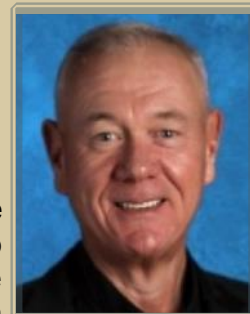

Our Challenge



Dear friends,

The vision of the prophet Daniel was clearly not of this world. He saw “one like the son of man” coming from heaven and receiving dominion, glory, and kingship over all things. Unlike kings and rulers of this world, his kingship will never be destroyed, and his dominion is everlasting. The book of Revelation presents an exalted view of Jesus Christ as the King of Kings. There are two important implications of this view of Christ. All earthly kings are limited by the authority of Christ, but they are also legitimated by the authority of Christ if they honor his values and purposes. In the evangelist John’s account of Jesus’ passion, Jesus did not deny his kingship when he was confronted by Pilate. But he refused to be identified with any human race or nation. He admitted that his kingdom was not of this world. He came to this world, not as a king but as a servant, to proclaim the truth of the kingdom of heaven. Hero-worship and king-making are usually examples of cultural idolatry. We constantly invest mere human beings with the power and status of gods. We grant them value beyond that of ordinary mortals. There is danger in conferring on anyone such status. The only eternal king is Christ who died for the sins of the whole world. Earthly kings are pale imitations of the Heavenly King, yet we can learn something about the life of faith from our political experience. The Heavenly King demands our obedience by earning our respect and trust. He commands our loyalty by loving us unconditionally. Christ the King reigns *incognito* in our world. He does not live in palaces. He does not display great wealth. He does not wield political power. He rules through the cry of the poor for justice, the cry of the oppressed for freedom, the cry of the despised for acceptance, the cry of the weak for strength. Christ the King is on the side of those who struggle for dignity and opportunity.

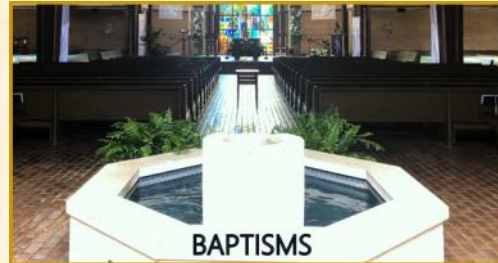

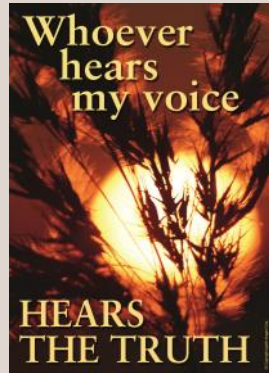

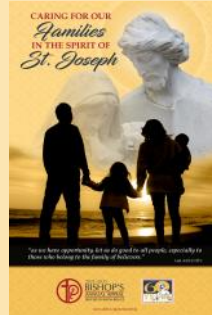
