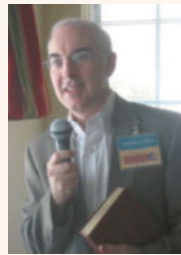
CARE OF THE SICK

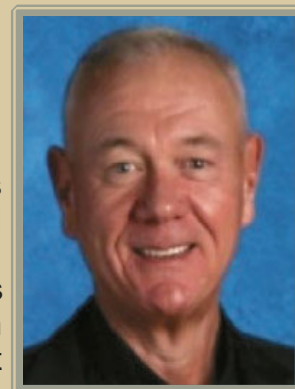

Our Challenge

Dear friends,

Jonah of the Old Testament was one of the first missionaries. God called this Hebrew to go and preach to the great city of Ninevah, which was pagan and Gentile! Jonah called the entire city to repentance, thus saving it from destruction. The ancient story of Jonah reminds us that God loves Jews and Gentiles! This weekend's passage from the first letter of St. Paul to the earliest Christians in Corinth, Greece, reminds us that the apostle Paul believed Christ would return at any time. Though Christ did not return as Paul expected, the apostle's advice about being ready, or prepared, is valuable. We ought to live in such a way that we are always ready for the dawn of the eternal kingdom of God. We may not always see it, but the call of Jesus always had a radical dimension to it. He was not merely asking his followers to be well-behaved. He was challenging them to be revolutionaries. They were to leave their old lives and place the kingdom of God above all else, whatever the cost. That Christian discipleship is costly was not an original idea with theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer. He got our attention because he wrote about costly discipleship and paid in full. Jesus never suggested any other kind of discipleship. He urged his hearers to "*count the cost.*" He called his disciples to "*come and die,*" and they did. It takes courage to follow Jesus. Discipleship is life in continual transition. Following Christ means no longer following former leaders and values. To say 'Yes' to Christ means saying 'No' to our old masters and priorities. Whatever lies behind us as a part of our past, we have the opportunity to change our course and move in a different direction. Created in God's image, we possess the freedom to choose. God will never coerce us, but calls us to take the paths of right living and Christ-like loving. The decision is ours day by day to choose life by walking in the footsteps of Jesus. It takes courage to follow Jesus and is invariably costly. The testimony of generations of the faithful is that more is gained than lost.
