

St.Joseph's Day Altar

What is a St. Joseph's Day altar?

The celebration of the St. Joseph's Altar is a deep-rooted tradition in southeastern Louisiana brought by the Italians from Sicily. In the Middle Ages, the people of Sicily were experiencing a drought. They prayed through the intercession of St. Joseph and promised that, if the drought ended, they would honor him yearly and thank him for his prayers on their behalf.

Today, creating the St. Joseph's Altar together brings families and communities together and sustains them with a shared spirituality, through good times and bad.


What is a Tupa Tupa?

The Tupa-Tupa reenactment traditionally takes place immediately before the blessing of the St. Joseph's Altar. The Sicilian word "tupa" means to knock, and this pageant tells the story of Bethlehem, when Joseph, the protector of the Holy Family, was seeking shelter for Mary before the birth of Baby Jesus. The Holy Family proceeds to knock on three doors before being let in and greeted with the words, "Welcome. Come in. A feast has been prepared for you!" The pagent continues as Jesus, Mary, Joseph, and any other saints and angels go to the altar, then to a traditional breaking of the bread.

What is on a St. Joseph's Day Altar?

The altar itself is comprised of three tiers, with the focal point on the top tier a picture or statue of St. Joseph. Surrounding St. Joseph are various florals, fresh fruit and vegetables, candles, savory and sweet dishes, and wine. There may also be pictures or mementos of loved ones who have passed.


One thing that will definitely not be found on a St. Joseph's Altar is meat of any kind. This is because St. Joseph's Day is celebrated during the solemn season of Lent.



Our Challenge

Dear friends:

In the long history of Israel it is possible to see God relating to the people in different ways at different times. Similar to human parent-child relationships, the law comes first. The prophet Jeremiah sees a future time, however, when the law will be internalized by the people, "written on their hearts." In our second reading this weekend Christ's obedience is praised by the unknown writer of the letter to the Hebrews. As God's Son, Jesus was subject to God's laws and was obedient. He suffered of his devotion to God's will, but he was faithful, even to the point of death. He became the Savior of the world. Our gospel passage this weekend



records Jesus as saying that "unless a grain of wheat falls into the earth and dies," it does not fulfill its purpose. Jesus drew people to God, not by breaking their wills, but by winning their hearts. Suffering love was more compelling than any forceful strategy could have ever been. One of the "Seven Deadly Sins," of course, is greed. Jesus called attention to the futility and foolishness of greed. In extreme cases it is perhaps the most conspicuous example of self-centeredness, but greed's strength is in the less obvious ways it influences the general public. A poor person can be every bit as greedy as a wealthy person. The battle against greed must be waged on many fronts. Even then, it will be impossible to transform a whole culture overnight. We all have spheres of influence, however, and the influence of each of us is needed. For people of faith the trouble with greed is two-fold. First, it is an obsession that cannot fulfill the promises it makes, so is ultimately frustrating if not destructive. Second, greed and God have a difficult time co-existing. We cannot serve both God and Mammon. If greed is 'calling the shots' in a person's life, that person's faith will tend to be inauthentic or hypocritical. If a nation or a culture succumbs to greed, people of faith will have difficult choices to make.

The Eucharistic Revival... What is it?

A Pew survey found only 31% of Catholics believe the Eucharist is the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Our Lord, Jesus Christ.

To address this, the Bishops of America set out on a three year plan to teach the faithful about the Eucharist. We are in year two, culminating in a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis July 17 - 21, 2024. The hope is we will all grow closer to Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist.

The Holy Eucharist will go on a pilgrimage through 4 routes crisscrossing the United States; the Holy Eucharist will come to St. Joseph's Cathedral in Baton Rouge on June 6 - 7, 2024.

On August 14 - 15, 2024, the Host will travel down the Mississippi in an 80' tall Monstrance from Baton Rouge to New Orleans during the Fête-Dieu du Mississippi. Let us all go out to meet Our Lord as he traverses our country!
