


CARE OF THE SICK

Peter's Pence (Collection for the Holy Father) Sunday June 26, 2022 Second Collection





Our Challenge

Dear friends,

Relationships within families are very important. But the calling of the prophet Elisha that we hear about in this weekend's Old Testament reading is a reminder that loyalty to family cannot be put ahead of loyalty to the kingdom of God. Our love for family and friends must not stand in the way of our love for aliens and enemies. St. Paul gave us a simple recipe for peace when speaking to the



earliest Christian Church he founded in Galatia (modern-day north central Turkey). He shared with them the second greatest commandment given by Jesus: "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." We will never find domestic peace or world peace until we stop despising each other and start loving each other. The only solution to prejudice (pre-judging others) is learning to love one another. The gospel passage this weekend reflects that Jesus' first followers were prejudiced against the folks from Samaria. In this incident from the life of Jesus we see the sheer irrationality of prejudice. His disciples were infuriated that the Samaritans would not allow them passage through their land. They were ready to annihilate them for adding a few extra miles to their journey. Many different things may alienate one person from another. Anger or hurt over a perceived wrong, for example. Different loyalties can separate people, often over mundane things. But the most tragic cause of alienation between people is the conviction on the part of one that the other is inherently inferior and unacceptable. The world needs voices of sanity and reason to counteract those political leaders who play on our religious, racial, and class prejudice. Those who call on us to love the outcasts may not win elections, but they will save our society. We acknowledge that love is the only solution to the prejudicial conflicts that divide our world. Our leaders betray us into thinking that our religious, racial, and class biases are normal. Our own survival, and our own happiness, depend on treating others as we would have them treat us. People cannot be argued out of their prejudices. Charles Mildmay wrote: "Reasoning against a prejudice is like fighting against a shadow; it exhausts the reasoned, without visibly affecting the prejudice." The only way to overcome prejudice is to put ourselves in the shoes of those whom we fear and hate.

VACATION BIBLE SCHOOL 2022



Vacation Bible School was celebrated during the week of June 13-16, 2022 with 185 campers plus 14 in the VBS nursery attended the celebration. Our theme this year was Wilderness Escape- Moses Leads the Israelites out of Slavery in Egypt. Trust God! The week included music, games, crafts, snacks, and skits.

The 5th and 6th Graders worked on two service projects. They filled 150 "Bags of Hope" for the St. Vincent de Paul Dining Room. The "Bags of Hope" is a program sponsored by St. Vincent de Paul to give homeless visitors food to go. Each bag contained a bottle of water, a juice pouch, a fruit cup and a fruit and cracker snack. The 5th and 6th graders also learned how to make plarn, or plastic yarn, by recycling plastic grocery bags. Plarn is used by various local groups to crochet sleeping mats for the homeless. The VBS students made enough balls of plarn to fill a paper shopping bag. The plarn was donated to a local crochet group called Crochet Compassion.





St. Bernadette Relic Tour


