

Our Challenge

Dear friends:


In the prophet Ezekiel's words this weekend, we hear echoes of the Twenty-third Psalm and of the Gospels' image of Jesus as the Good Shepherd. Like a shepherd, God treats his people with compassion. He goes in search of those who wander, binds up those who are injured, heals the sick, and provides pastureland and rest for all. In St. Paul's message to the earliest Christians in Corinth, Greece,



that we hear this weekend, Jesus was inaugurated as king at his resurrection. His reign will endure until his second coming, at which time he will hand over the kingdom to his Father God. At this time God's relationship with redeemed humanity will be a direct one. The reign of Christ is the power that saves us from death and equips us for life. Jesus' rendering of the last judgment has some surprises for some orthodox expressions of Christian faith. The nations of the earth are judged, not in terms of doctrinal purity or ritual observance, but by a simpler standard. Those are blessed who have served Christ by serving the least of needy humanity. The difference between kings and shepherds is obvious. Jesus is ultimately Lord of all, but his lordship is best understood in the gentle, caring characteristics of the shepherd. In the great judgment, King Jesus will look upon humanity with eyes of the Good Shepherd. The single issue will be whether we have extended ourselves to the least of our brothers and sisters in compassion and care. In this season of Thanksgiving we are all grateful for our friends. What constitutes a friend? Henry Adams maintained, "One friend in a lifetime is much; two are many; three are hardly possible." Kahlil Gibran wrote that "your friend is your needs answered." In the end, Jesus' concern will not be how many friends we have but what kind of friends we have been to the friendless, the needy, and the fallen.






