company. We would love to have you come check us out! Join us at Gonzaga Hall Library from 9:00-11:00 AM on the first and third Thursday of the month. All are welcome!



Our Challenge

Dear friends,


The Bible portrays faith as a paradoxical partnership between the individual and God. We can decide to seek God's will, but we can only do God's will with the help of God. God must give us what we choose, and we must choose what God gives us. We cannot imagine all the things that lie ahead of us when we choose the way of holiness. But God gives us the light we need for the journey of faith. Each step we take brings us closer to the holy mystery of God's grace. Why did Jesus make



such extraordinary demands of his disciples? He put wrong 'thinking' in the same category as wrong 'doing' in order to show that we can never become holy on our own strength. Our holiness ultimately comes as a gift from God. Maybe you have jokingly said, "I'm humble and proud of it!" This phrase captures the difficulty of the person who is trying to live a holy life. How can we strive for holiness without falling into the pride that undermines holiness? The only way to avoid pride is to recognize that whatever holiness we possess comes from God. The surest way to miss out on holiness is to become holy for our own sake rather than for the sake of others. Holiness is no technique for gaining earthly happiness or heavenly reward. Holiness is a way of glorifying God and serving others. Life is filled with strange ironies. Neither happiness nor holiness can be won by our own efforts. The most important things in life come to us indirectly, as by-products of our service to other people. We are blessed primarily when we are a blessing to others.

"Our paschal lamb, Christ, has been sacrificed." These words of St. Paul in his Letter to the Corinthians express the highest mystery of the Catholic faith, which Christians around the world contemplate and celebrate every year during the Lent and Easter seasons: the suffering, dying, and rising of Jesus.

In this year's devotional book, *The Paschal Mystery: Reflections for Lent and Easter,* readers are offered a week-by-week guide through these sacred seasons with a series of reflections on Lenten themes like death, temptation, repentance, prayer, fasting, and almsgiving; the events of the Paschal Mystery of Christ recalled during Holy Week; and the joy of the Gospel reflected in the Easter season.

in ministry, prayer and resources. During this year's stewardship effort, we encourage every member of our faith community respond to our Stewardship through Offering invitation.



St. Aloysius Habitat for Humanity






