Families of the sick are encouraged to contact the Pastoral Services Center at 343-6657. Communion is brought to the sick weekly. Hospital visits are also made weekly.





During Advent, Altar Flowers usually do not decorate the church or sanctuary. The church is decorated gradually throughout the season of Advent until it is fully decorated by



Our Challenge

Dear friends:

In our Old Testament passage from the Book of Proverbs this weekend is provided the description of the perfect wife. Since these words come from an ancient time we might expect her chief characteristic to be subordination to her husband, but it is fidelity to God and to all her responsibilities. She brings good and not evil, and her works are praised by the general public. Our second reading reflects that the earliest Christians believed in the imminent return of the risen



Christ. Some took this to mean that they could simply take their ease. Paul corrected this point of view and called the people to be diligent in doing good, as children of the light. They were to be awake and alert, because the day of the Lord would come as a thief in the night. Jesus' parable in this weekend's gospel passage points to a wonderful equality among people in the sight of God. The principle of stewardship means that each of us is responsible for whatever has been entrusted to us. God does not value those with many gifts more than the modestly gifted. Ultimately we are all judged on the basis of what we have done with what we have been given. Since most of us are concerned about economic realities, Jesus' parable about the talents may capture our attention. At one point the master in the story says, "For to everyone who has, more will be given and he will grow rich." Does God reward us financially? Some Christian proclamation makes such claims. But it is the Father's business we are to be busy about. In the economy of God's kingdom those who are rich in spirit, and are good stewards, do indeed become richer. Sometimes it is fear of failure that keeps us from success. Faith itself, however, involves an element of risk. Stewardship means serving God's kingdom both with generosity and with confidence, trusting the results to God's gracious providence. What does God give us? What we are given, primarily, is God's own self, God's love, God's spirit. When we are good stewards of God's presence within us, then it is multiplied with us, so that the more we have the more we are given. We increase God's spirit within us by sharing it, by giving it away. Conversely, to close the channels of our lives to others is to diminish the life God is attempting to give us. In the economy of the spirit, the more you give, the more you have.

A special prayer is included on the back of the booklets—please remember to pray for those who are less fortunate this holiday season. Donated items should be returned to the labeled boxes in the back of church beginning on November 20th. All gifts should be returned **unwrapped** by **Sunday, December 10th**.




