
St. Aloysius Church Monday, April 8, 2024 6:30 PM

Our Challenge

Dear friends:

We have in our first reading from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah a paradoxical truth about the Suffering Servant of God. Isaiah portrays God's Servant as one who accepts suffering at the hands of his enemies, yet as one who is well-spoken and persuasive. Only those who have suffered can relate to those who are suffering. Our Lord asks nothing of us that he does not experience himself. He laid aside all claims of privilege and power in fulfilling his mission. In the same way he asks us to put the needs of others ahead of our own selfish concerns. If we will do this, we will be blessed, just as Jesus was exalted by God.



Hearing this Passion Sunday the story of our Lord's suffering and death moves us deeply. Why would this man lay down his life without a struggle? Why would he trust God who seemed to abandon him? The answer is provided by the centurion who watched him die. "Surely this man was the Son of God!" The theologians have often presented Jesus in terms of the three great offices of Prophet, Priest, and King. In the Gospels Jesus is identified as a king from the beginning. The magi ask, "Where is he who has been born king of the Jews?" The irony is that the world has always used the title king with regard to Jesus, yet he completely transforms the traditional understanding of kingship. In our world today there are those who are sharing in the sufferings of Christ. The cross is not merely a religious symbol for such people but a living reality. Kings rule from thrones. Jesus ruled from a cross. Are we losing the true significance of the cross by making it a beautiful religion symbol and even a fashion item? We are to take up crosses and follow him, but our crosses are not the inconveniences and burdens that life brings to everyone. Crosses are chosen burdens. A cross is the burden of someone else that we choose to take on ourselves, just as Jesus' cross was the burden of the world's sin and need.

The Eucharistic Revival... What is it?

A Pew survey found only ${f 31\%}$ of Catholics believe the Eucharist is the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Our Lord, Jesus Christ.

To address this, the Bishops of America set out on a three year plan to teach the faithful about the Eucharist. We are in year two, culminating in a **National Eucharistic Congress** in Indianapolis July 17 - 21, 2024. The hope is we will all grow closer to Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist.

The Holy Eucharist will go on a pilgrimage through 4 routes crisscrossing the United States; the Holy Eucharist will come to St. Joseph's Cathedral in Baton Rouge on June 6 - 7, 2024.

On August 14 - 15, 2024, the Host will travel down the Mississippi in an 80' tall Monstrance from Baton Rouge to New Orleans during the Fête-Dieu du Mississippi.

Let us all go out to meet Our Lord as he traverses our country!






St. Aloysius at The Holy Grill
