



Our Challenge

Dear friends:

This weekend's Old Testament passage from the prophet Isaiah presents us with something of a strange read. A foreign ruler, Cyrus, who all Israelites would consider an utter pagan, is referred to as "God's anointed." Cyrus was the Persian ruler who overthrew the Babylonian empire and freed the Jewish exiles. The prophet's point is that God can use anyone, even someone who does not know God, to accomplish his purposes. Our second reading this weekend is from St. Paul's first letter to the earliest Christians in Thessolonika, Greece. It was written before any other document in the New Testament. St. Paul had started the Church




at Thessalonika, Greece, and was extremely pleased with Timothy's report to him on how the congregation was doing. He gives thanks to God for their "work of faith," their "labor of love," and their "endurance in hope." The setting of this weekend's gospel passage is that the Pharisees had set a trap for Jesus. They opposed paying taxes to the Roman emperor. Jewish King Herod's supporters, on the other hand, approved of paying the tax. Jesus avoided the trap and offered a wise principle: we are responsible for determining our citizenship responsibilities and our spiritual priorities. Where these are in conflict, our ultimate allegiance always belongs to God. Back in the 19th century, the famous atheist Robert Ingersoll would titillate and alarm his audiences by putting God on the clock. To prove that prayer was superfluous, he would ask God to strike him dead in ten minutes. Then he would wait with his audience until the ten minutes had passed and nothing happened, thus demonstrating his point. As people of faith, we often expect God to work both on our agendas and our timetables. In mature faith there is a strong element of patience. We are often presumptuous when we pray. We ask for something and expect God to respond immediately and in the way we want. Also, we often offer prayers to which we ourselves could be at least a part of the answer. It was the claim of George MacDonald that "in all his miracles Jesus did only in miniature what his Father does ever in the great." Jesus turning water into wine at Cana, for example, was awe-inspiring. But we should be at least as awed by the "natural" process whereby the fruit of the vine comes to our tables - - and to the Lord's Table. Creation itself is a miracle. God's redemptive work in history is a miracle, too. The prophet Isaiah saw that he was living in the midst of a prolonged miracle. Israel's experience of being defeated by Babylon, carried away into exile, and then allowed to return was a miracle of God's loving chastisement. God was leading Israel back to its divine purposes. Like most miracles, it took a long time.

Silver Rose Prayer Service

All members of the community are encouraged to join our Knights of Columbus Council 3743 at St. Aloysius Catholic Church on Monday, November 6, 2023 at 5:30 PM for a Rosary Prayer Service. Make plans for you and your family to attend.

The journey of the silver rose begins each year in March and ends December 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Every stop the Silver Rose makes throughout the pilgrimage is a Rosary-centered occasion for Knights, parishioners and community members to pray for respect for life. The Silver Rose program demonstrates the unity between Knights of Columbus in Canada, the United States and Mexico, through a series of prayer services promoting the dignity of all human life and honoring Our Lady.

The Silver Rose Program began in 1960, when the first rose – a real, live one – was blessed by a bishop in Ontario. The rose then traveled to New York and then to Texas where it was taken across the border into Mexico. The rose ended its pilgrimage at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey on Dec. 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. To better ensure future annual trips, a silver rose was ultimately made. Today, due to the popularity of the program throughout the North American continent, eight silver roses travel unique routes.
