



CARE OF THE SICK


Families of the sick are encouraged to contact the Pastoral Services Center at 343-6657. Communion is brought to the sick weekly. Hospital visits are also made weekly.

BEREAVEMENT COMMITTEE



The Bereavement Committee assists parishioners whose funeral services are held at St. Aloysius. Parish staff contacts the deceased's family and determines what assistance they would need. The Bereavement Committee

furnishes food for visitation and/or receptions after the funeral Mass. We usually need someone to assist with the visitation and reception. The time commitment for this is usually one-and-a-half to two hours. 

Our Challenge

Dear friends:

The prophet Isaiah envisions the culmination of history in a great banquet on the holy mountain of the Lord in Jerusalem. God's kingdom is portrayed as a feast of "rich food and choice wines." The temple "veil" will be removed and God will reveal himself to the people of all the nations of the earth. Isaiah was the first prophet to emphasize this universal dimension of God's purposes. Life is not always a banquet. The Apostle Paul is grateful to the earliest Christians in Philippi, Greece, for the gift of money they have sent him, but he speaks of having learned how to be content in all manner of circumstances.



He assures his readers that God will supply whatever they need through his "riches" in Christ Jesus. Jesus knew that not everyone would respond to God's invitation to his kingdom. Some would fail to see what they were missing. Jesus' parable in this weekend's gospel passage makes it clear that, while all have the freedom to refuse, the invitation to God's heavenly banquet is extended to all. No one is considered unworthy of God's love. It is said that, in the Victorian era, on the walls of some children's bedrooms there was hung a framed picture of a huge eye. Underneath was usually found a version of the words from Genesis 16:13: "Thou art a God of seeing." It is a little difficult to believe that the picture was there to comfort the child. Some of us have had the impression all our lives that being "seen" and "known" by God is terribly threatening. This is not the Bible's perspective at all. What difference would it make if we saw the world through the eyes of Jesus Christ? For one thing, we would not see any person exclusively in terms of superficial perceptions or outward appearances. We would see each person in intensely "personal" terms, that is, as who he or she truly is. The thought of being under the "divine scrutiny" is terrifying to some. How we feel about it depends entirely on how we understand the nature of God. The writer of Psalm 139 does not find the all-seeing eye of God to be a threat. Rather, it is a great source of comfort and joy. "O Lord, thou hast searched me and known me!" is an exclamation. Some translators render it, "O Lord, thou hast dug deep into me!" If God were our enemy, looking for reasons to judge and punish us, it would be natural to try to hide from him. But God is love. God knows us better than we know ourselves. God loves us as we are and longs to help us become all that we can be.

Is Stephen Ministry Calling You?

"A Steady Reminder of God's Presence," remarks a woman who tells how having a Stephen Minister during a family crisis gave her a spiritual anchor and the opportunity to focus on her own



This story and many others like this are shared by care receivers voluntarily on the Stephen Ministry website www.stephenministries.org and describes how Stephen Ministry makes a difference in the lives of those who needed this ministry in their communities. Launched in 1975 and headquartered in St. Louis, Missouri, Stephen Ministry now serves 13,000 congregations worldwide, of which St. Aloysius Parish is included. Stephen Ministry is a lay ministry that supplements pastoral care. Trained members provide one-on-one confidential, Christ-centered care to individuals facing a variety of life struggles and transitions, such as grief, chronic illness, job loss, divorce, cancer, or financial difficulties.

Perhaps you are hearing the call to follow God's promises for you by serving as a Stephen Minister. Yes, Stephen Ministry is a time commitment - training hours and visiting care receivers - but you will reap great dividends in the form of graces and blessings through the experiences. The required 50-hour training course begins in January and includes the following dates: January 4th, 11th, 18th, 25th; February 1st, 8th, 22nd, 29th; March 7th, 14th, 21st; and April 4th, 11th. A Commissioning Ceremony is held during Mass after the program ends.






