



Our Challenge

Dear friends,

Many people have dreamed of being granted one wish or request. In our first reading this weekend, we hear that it happened to King Solomon. He could have chosen long life, immense wealth, or military success. Instead, he chose wisdom: "an understanding heart to govern your people and to distinguish right from wrong." He evidenced great wisdom in his choice, and God granted his request. Still writing to the earliest Christians in Rome in this weekend's second reading, St. Paul offers a profound understanding of how God is involved in our lives,




especially in our times of suffering. God does not cause everything that happens, but God is at work in whatever happens to us, seeking to use the experience to help us grow more fully into the image of Jesus Christ. Our culture's quantitative values place a premium on "how big" and "how much." Jesus put the emphasis on qualitative values, on quality of life. A true treasure, such as the kingdom of God, is worth sacrificing all the temporary, unfulfilling things the world thinks are so important. A popular Television Show a number of years ago was called "I've Got a Secret." The guest always had a secret and the panelists worked at guessing what it was. Some secrets remain unknown to us forever. Many of the mysteries of God confound us. Apparently, God is good at keeping secrets. A father questioned his son about an incident involving another boy in the neighborhood. The son asked, "Dad, can you keep a secret?" The father said, "Yes, of course." The son said, "So can I." We speak of God as the One to whom all hearts are open and all secrets are known. God knows all about us and loves us anyway. God's secrets are revealed to us in God's own time. Often God waits until we are mature enough or wise enough to be good stewards of his holy mysteries. Even then, beyond what we know of God and his eternal kingdom, there are mysteries and secrets we cannot begin to fathom.

MISSION APPEAL AT ST. ALOYSIUS PARISH: AUGUST 12th & 13th (All Masses)

Every year the Diocese of Baton Rouge invites deserving missionaries to be involved in the Missionary Cooperative Plan. This year Fr. Steve Rodrigues (a Franciscan Capuchin from south India) will make an appeal so that the Capuchin Franciscan mission can continue in India.

Our Ministries: Following the example of St. Francis of Assisi, Capuchins give priority to two ministries: working with the poor and preaching the Word of God. Under these two descriptions fall a variety of ministries that further the dream of St. Francis: serving in prisons, homeless shelters, dispensaries, elderly, youth ministry, taking care of orphans, retreat centers, looking after poor parishes, free medical care for the poor, etc. We humbly request you to generously support us in these ministries.

We have a special charism for working with the poor, orphans, neglected and the forgotten and taking those assignments which others refuse. The special collection from all the weekend Masses August 12th and 13th, will go to take care of the following projects:

To construct 7 classrooms for the education of the slow learners of the remote village (children and adults).

Feeding, sustaining, educating and other basic facilities for 75 boys in a poor village.

Renovation of the Boarding building and school for the underprivileged, migrants, street children etc. The building is in a bad shape and needs urgent attention.

To help around 50 young children who have lost both of their parents due to Covid-19.

To construct a community hall: to give free medical aid for the poor; and to give education to children, women and men in remote villages.




The Seminarian raffle ticket sales this past weekend at church was a great success with 815 tickets sold for a total intake of \$4077. The number of tickets includes individuals who


