



### **Our Challenge**

#### Dear friends:

It is through human beings that God's purposes are accomplished in human history. Some individuals are marked out for the special work of reconciliation. Redemptive work never comes easy, however. The price of reconciliation is sacrifice and suffering. St. Paul was called to be an apostle of Jesus Christ. This calling cost him dearly, however. He was rejected by his own people. He was



beaten, ship-wrecked, imprisoned and stoned. He endured this undeserved suffering for the sake of his mission to the Gentiles. The remarkable power of the suffering of the innocent is a mystery. Police force and corporal punishment may control but cannot conquer evil. Suffering on behalf of others, however, often softens evil hearts and transforms wayward lives. We do not live in a perfect world. Sinners are not always punished, and saints are not always rewarded. There are times when the consequences of sin fall on the innocent rather than the guilty. Such undeserved suffering strains our sense of justice. Yet, strange as it seems, these inequities do not destroy the moral order in the universe. It is difficult enough dealing with the sufferings we bring on ourselves. It is infinitely harder to suffer the consequences of someone else's sin. Christ taught us to bear one another's burdens, whether we deserve such suffering or not. Gandhi and Martin Luther King, Jr. proved the power of non-violence. Gandhi brought the British Empire to its knees through passive resistance to age-old prejudices. King stirred our nation's conscience through passive resistance to unjust laws. Both men paid with their lives for their campaigns on behalf of others.

# Baby Bottle Campaign 2023

The Dignity of Life Committee of St. Aloysius and the Knights of Columbus will be launching the 2023 Baby Bottle Campaign January 21st and 22nd to aid our local crisis pregnancy centers. We cannot say we are a pro-life church if we do not care for both the mother and her baby. That is why we support our crisis pregnancy centers and their life saving work. This year we are once again supporting **two** life saving centers: the **Pregnancy Problem Center** and the **Woman's New Life Center**. Now that Roe v. Wade has been overturned their role is even more important to the life of the mother and child.

These two centers have been giving women in crisis pregnancies an alternative to abortion for many years and have saved many babies and their mothers from the nightmare of abortion. Both have free pregnancy tests and have ultrasound machines so mothers can see their babies in their womb. The PPC has a Mom and Me Shop to help clothe and feed both moms and babies and offer Earn to Learn program to help moms and dads become better parents with healthier babies. The Woman's New Life Center offers professional counseling, educational resources, and post abortion counseling. They also teach Natural Family Planning.

Last year's campaign was very successful. We want this Baby Bottle Campaign to be the best yet, especially since we're helping two centers. The cost of running the center is expensive, but you cannot put a price tag on the lives and souls saved. Please help us to offset their expenses with your donation.

Just pick up your bottle on January 21st or 22nd. Return it the next week with your donation inside. It is that simple.



### Join the St. Aloysius Men's Choir






