






Our Challenge

Dear friends,

God's patience and longsuffering are one of the reasons there is evil in the world. God is like the wise parent who allows the child to make mistakes and experience the consequences. The truth is, God rules the world in leniency and loves us. There is the constant challenge of deciding between the better and the worse in our gray world of good and evil. In our ambiguity, the Spirit of God helps us to find the will of God and make the proper choices. Jesus understood that evil cannot be completely eliminated from the world. Many of our efforts to purge the world only



multiply the evil. We can bear these situations in the knowledge that ultimately good will triumph over evil. The greatest challenge to the faithful is the intermingling of good and evil in the world and in our lives. The line between good and evil is clear only to God. There is enough evil in the world to threaten our faith, and there is enough goodness in the world to sustain our faith. Our faith rests in God who transcends this ambiguity. Living is simpler when the issues are clearly differentiated. Deciding between obvious goods and evils takes courage but is not confusing. St. Augustine and all the theologians who have sat at his feet have understood the gray ambiguity that covers this world like a fog. It is like two cities, or two kingdoms, that everywhere intermingle and interpenetrate. No one can see clearly where one leaves off and the other begins. Only God can perfectly distinguish between these two realities, and in the fullness of time God will see to the triumph of good over evil. In the meantime, we walk by faith, not by sight.



MISSION APPEAL AT ST. ALOYSIUS PARISH: AUGUST 12th & 13th (All Masses)



Every year the Diocese of Baton Rouge invites deserving missionaries to be involved in the Missionary Cooperative Plan. This year Fr. Steve Rodrigues (a Franciscan Capuchin from south India) will make an appeal so that the Capuchin Franciscan mission can continue in India.

Our Ministries: Following the example of St. Francis of Assisi, Capuchins give priority to two ministries: working with the poor and preaching the Word of God. Under these two descriptions fall a variety of ministries that further the dream of St. Francis: serving in prisons, homeless shelters, dispensaries, elderly, youth ministry, taking care of orphans, retreat centers, looking after poor parishes, free medical care for the poor, etc. We humbly request you to generously support us in these ministries.

We have a special charism for working with the poor, orphans, neglected and the forgotten; and taking those assignments which others refuse. The special collection from all the weekend Masses August 12th and 13th, will go to take care of the following projects:

To construct 7 classrooms for the education of the slow learners of the remote village (children and adults).

Feeding, sustaining, educating and other basic facilities for 75 boys in a poor village.

Renovation of the Boarding building and school for the underprivileged, migrants, street children etc. The building is in a bad shape and needs urgent attention.

To help around 50 young children who have lost both of their parents due to Covid-19.

To construct a community hall: to give free medical aid for the poor; and to give education to children, women and men in remote

villages.

We are financially very weak and to carry forward our mission we depend on the providence of God, and on your generous and benevolent help. Thank you for your willingness to support us in our mission. God bless you abundantly for your generosity and sacrifices.


