




Baby Bottle Campaign 2024 Need Now More Than Ever

We will be outside the church doors giving out baby bottles January 20th and 21st after each mass. Return the bottle the next week with your donation. It is that simple!

We are doing our part in supporting our area pregnancy centers Pregnancy Problem Center and Women's New Life Center as they help women and their babies through crisis pregnancies. We collected nearly \$15000.00 for them last year. These two centers have been giving women in crisis pregnancies an alternative to abortion for many years and have saved many babies and their mothers from the nightmare of abortion. Both have free pregnancy tests and have ultrasound machines so mothers can see their babies in their womb. The PPC has a Mom and Me Shop to help clothe and feed both Moms and babies and offer Earn to Learn program to help Mom's and Dad's become better parents with healthier babies. The Woman's New Life Center offers professional counseling, educational resources, and post abortion counseling. They also teach Natural Family Planning. Visit the centers websites to learn more of the services they provide.

The cost of running the center is expensive, but you cannot put a price tag on the lives and souls saved. With our support and the support of other churches and organizations we can keep these centers open. Thanks again and God bless you for your past and future generosity.



Our Challenge

Dear friends.


From the First Book of Samuel in the Old Testament, we learn that Samuel had been dedicated to serve in the temple by his mother. But God had more important things for Samuel to do. In this weekend's first reading, God called Samuel by name in the dead of night. Twice Samuel thought it was Eli calling. Then, as Eli suggested, Samuel answered, "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening." In his




first letter to the earliest Christians in Corinth, Greece, St. Paul used images to describe our relationship to Christ that are difficult for moderns. He said our "bodies" are "members of Christ," and that our bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit who is within us. The important thing is that the analogies stress the closeness and intimacy of the relationship. In this weekend's passage from St. John's gospel, John the Baptist pointed out Jesus to two of his own disciples, saying, "Behold, the Lamb of God." They followed Jesus and met him. One of them, Andrew, went and told his brother Simon, "We have found the Messiah." One telling another is how the Christian movement began. Few things are as exciting as answering the call to a new adventure. Mountain climbers and marathon runners engage in physical adventures. Scientists and teachers have intellectual adventures. Artists and poets have adventures in creativity. Faith is a genuine adventure. Jesus invited people to follow him and they were changed forever. Sometimes the invitation of Christ, or the call of God, comes to us through others, often people in need. Sometimes it comes from needy situations. "He is the Way. Follow him through the Land of Unlikeness. You will see rare beasts, and have unique adventures." (W. H. Auden) Where should we begin with Jesus? By simply accepting his invitation to follow him. We do not know where this will lead us, but it will be in the direction of God's holy will for us. That is enough for now.






