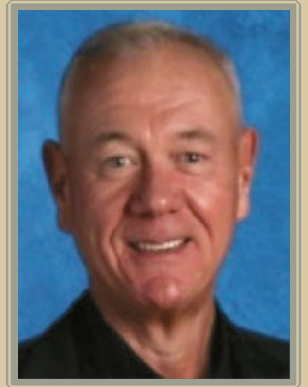

Our Challenge

Dear friends:

In this weekend's first reading from the Acts of the Apostles, Peter has harsh words for his hearers for their part in crucifying Jesus, but he acknowledges that their actions were done in ignorance. He indicates that God has acted in faithfulness to his ancient promises, and has raised Jesus from the dead. Peter then issues a call to repentance so that the sins of his hearers may be forgiven. In our second reading from the first letter of St. John, he addresses his readers as "my children," and speaks to them of the Father's love. If we fall into sin, we have an advocate and intercessor in Jesus Christ. We can live in the assurance that God's heart is full of love for us and that his commandments are for our own good. In our gospel passage from St. Luke's gospel, two of the disciples, who were going to Emmaus, recognized the risen Christ when they broke bread together. The other disciples then encountered him in a meal on the beach. We experience the presence of Christ in the same way, in the family of the faithful and through his sacramental gifts. A frequent crossword puzzle clue is, "Perennial best-seller: The _____." The answer, of course, is "Bible." The great irony is that, while it has been so widely circulated and translated into almost every language, the Bible is so rarely read. Polls and questionnaires invariably indicate that, on the one hand, the great majority of people revere the Bible and consider it to be inspired, but that, on the other hand, the Bible is not well known and is seldom read. We often complain that we do not know the will of God. The fact is that God in Christ has revealed a great deal of his will to us. We tend to focus on what we don't know, which usually involves a matter of self-interest, instead of acting on the knowledge we have. The Bible is the record of God's revelation in history for redemptive purposes. In it are great wisdom and the testimonies of our spiritual forebears. Spending time in the pages of Scripture is one of the disciplines of faith because it helps us to know better the mind and heart of God. Sometimes the Bible can be a difficult, even confusing companion. Ultimately, however, we are responsible for doing God's will to whatever degree we understand it. Some honest soul said, *"It isn't the parts of the Bible I don't understand that bother me. It is the parts that I do understand and am doing nothing about!"*

First Eucharist Weekend Reminders

First Eucharist will be celebrated on April 13 & 14 during the 4:30 Vigil Mass on Saturday and during the 9:00 AM, 11:00 AM & 5:30 PM Masses on Sunday. Please pray for our candidates who will be receiving their First Eucharist this year.

FIRST EUCHARIST SEATING: First Eucharist Candidates will be seated with each other in alphabetical order, in reserved pews in the main aisle of the church. Their First Eucharist certificate, nametag, and banner will be placed in their pew. Families and guests may choose to sit in either transept or the main nave of the church. Families may invite as many guests as they would like. Ushers will be available to assist in directing the children and their families to their pews.

RECEPTION OF THE EUCHARIST: During Communion time, the priest will instruct the children to come forward and receive their First Communion before the rest of the assembly. The First Communicants have been prepared by their teachers/catechists to receive the Body of Christ in their hand. Reception of the Cup will be offered at this time. 

The Eucharistic Revival... What is it?

A pew survey found only 31% of Catholics believe the Eucharist is the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Our Lord, Jesus Christ. To address this, the Bishops of America set out on a 3 year plan to teach the faithful about the Eucharist. We are in year two, culminating in a National Eucharistic Congress in Indianapolis July 17 - 21, 2024. (The hope is we will all grow closer to Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist.)

The Holy Eucharist will go on a pilgrimage through 4 routes crisscrossing the United States; the Holy Eucharist will come through Baton Rouge on June 6 - 7, 2024. Let us all go out to meet Our Lord as he traverses our country!
