


Video about Adoration



Our Challenge

Dear friends,

Our first reading this weekend reflects that the prophet Zechariah watched foreign powers invade and defeat his people. He envisioned a day when a different kind of king would rule Israel, one who brought an end to warfare and poverty. These words of Zechariah lie in the background of Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. In our second reading this weekend, writing to the earliest Christian Church in Rome, St. Paul does not use "flesh" and "spirit" to mean "body" and "soul," as we



understand these words. "Flesh" represents the human rebellion against God's will. "Spirit" is the capacity to respond to God's spirit. The way of the "spirit" is the way of Christ and means life for us. In our gospel passage this weekend, Jesus extends an invitation to those who are weary of life's trials and tribulations. The rest he offers is not physical, as in rest from work. It is spiritual rest and renewal. The way to which Jesus calls us offers both rest for weary spirits and meaningful work in sharing Jesus' ministry. There is a mountain of evidence that to be human is to be mortal, finite, and utterly without super-powers. Every sixteen or seventeen hours we have to lie down and lose consciousness for seven or eight hours of sleep. We have public rest stops and rest areas everywhere. Worse, if we don't get our rest, we get cranky. Humans need their rest. Following Jesus allows us to live with increased freedom and grow into greater maturity. Our former striving for self-sufficiency left little room for God in our lives. Ministering to other people, but ultimately trusting in God, brings us the peace that passes understanding. St. Augustine wrote that, because God made us for himself, our hearts are restless until they find their rest in God. This is a remarkable insight. The restlessness we experience apart from God is spiritual, of course, not physical. Therefore, our need is not for physical rest but for spiritual peace. To rest in God is a beautiful image of oneness with God, which is the goal of faith.





Grief Support Series Begins in the Fall

The St. Aloysius Stephen Ministry is sponsoring a 10-week grief support book series study written by Dr. Alan Wolfelt, which launches in September with a series of ten morning sessions offered.

Dr. Wolfelt, Director of the Center for Loss and Life's Transition®, writes about grief in one of his many Books, "Mourning in our culture isn't always easy. Normal thoughts and feelings connected to loss are typically seen as unnecessary and even shameful. Instead of encouraging mourners to express themselves, our culture's unstated rules would have them avoid their hurt and 'be strong.' But grief is not a disease. Instead, it's the normal, healthy process of embracing the mystery of the death of someone loved. If mourners see themselves as active participants in their healing, they will experience a renewed sense of meaning and purpose in life."

Morning Grief Support sessions begin on Wednesday, September 6th from 9:00 -10:30 AM in the PSC Conference Room, and continue every Wednesday, Sept. 13th, 20th, 27th, Oct. 4th, Oct. 11th, 18th, 25th, Nov. 1st, 8th and 15th. The cost of the materials is \$25.00 which includes the book and journal. The support group will be led by Dana Territo, Stephen Ministry Leader, who has been trained at the Alan Wolfelt Loss and Transition Center in Colorado, as well as facilitated by other Stephen Ministry members, too. 




