
CARE OF THE SICK






Our Challenge

Dear friends,

When the Jewish exiles returned to Israel from their captivity in Babylon (Baghdad), they found their homeland partially occupied by non-Jewish people from other countries. In this weekend's Old Testament passage from the Book of the Prophet Isaiah, he called for a new, broader understanding of God's covenant with Israel. This passage introduces a much more inclusive understanding of God's love and purposes. The people of God must never think they have a monopoly on the truth. Like the prophet Isaiah, St. Paul is introducing a new vision of God's inclusive nature in our second reading passage this weekend from his



letter to the earliest Christians in Rome. St. Paul saw his calling to be Christ's apostle to the gentiles (pagans). For this he was criticized and persecuted. Still, the commitment of his life was carrying the gospel of Christ to the whole world. His own people's rejection of Jesus, he believed, had helped open the way for gentiles to receive the gospel. The messages of the prophet Isaiah and the apostle Paul have much in common. Both saw that God's love is more inclusive than God's people have realized. The "neighbor" becomes everyone. In Christ the door to the kingdom of God is open to all. "Whosoever will, may come." Throughout the history of biblical religion there is a movement from a more narrow, restrictive perspective to a more expansive, inclusive direction. This is evident in both the Old and New Testaments. Our individual growth toward spiritual maturity follows the same pattern. Beginning with the awareness that "God loves me" we grow toward the recognition that "God loves everyone." Our customary schedules and routines may keep us from even seeing many of God's children, much less seeing their needs. "Out of sight, out of mind" is all too true. They are never out of God's sight, however. In the earliest days of my 30 year chaplain career in the USAFR, I was stationed at Tempelhof Air Base in West Berlin, which at the time was still entirely behind a wall, and had been the drop-site of the historic 'Berlin Airlift' at the end of WWII during the Soviet occupation of East Germany. We still rejoice in the memory of the day the Berlin Wall began to come down. The purpose of walls is to separate. In practical ways, walls can be useful and even protective. Spiritually, however, walls alienate and are destructive. The work of God's Holy Spirit involves the breaking down of walls - - - spiritually, religiously, personally. Let us pray that the world may experience a change in direction and follow the leading of God's Holy Spirit.






