

Our Challenge

Dear friends,

The story of the fall of Adam and Eve which we have in this weekend's first reading is a powerful parable about how we fall into the clutches of evil. We do not realize that evil creeps up on us by offering something good. The lure of pleasure and the lust for power are often the first steps toward evil and destructive experiences. Philosophers who worry about why the human race is condemned because of the sins of Adam and Eve miss the point. In our second reading this



weekend from St. Paul's letter to the earliest Christian Church in Rome, it is drawing attention to the fact that lives of great evil begin with a single offense. We must not under estimate the importance of evil's first steps. In this weekend's passage from St. Matthew's gospel we hear of the temptations faced by Jesus himself. Each of the temptations of Jesus had the appearance of being a good thing. Why not turn stones into bread? Why not put God to the test? Why not gain power in the world? But these were actions that would have deflected Jesus from his God-given task. Few people intentionally set out to become criminals or addicts. They inch their way into a life of crime by petty thievery. They slip into a life of substance abuse by experimenting with drugs or alcohol. Such apparently harmless actions and practices become the first steps toward a downward path and a tragic life. The example of Jesus teaches us that we cannot live apart from temptation. The most perfect life is still confronted with opportunities to sin. But we also learn from Jesus that we can overcome temptation by the word of God. The source is anonymous, but the truth of this familiar dictum is profound: "Sow a thought, and you reap an act; Sow a character, and you reap a destiny." Small steps lead to momentous consequences for evil or for good!





Organist and composer John S. Dixon will perform on the St. Aloysius' Casavant Frères


pipe organ on Friday, March 3rd at 7:00 PM.
