Engaged couples should contact the priest at least six months prior to their anticipated wedding date.





Our Challenge

Dear friends:

Old Testament prophets such as Malachi were bold in their condemnations of irresponsible leaders. Some leaders lead their people in the wrong direction. Some are available to the highest bidder. Some use their office to gain more power. The prophet declares that God will send a curse on leaders who fail to lead. In our second reading this weekend, St. Paul provided wise and helpful leadership of the earliest Christian Church in Thessalonika, Greece. He worked



night and day both doing ministry and earning his living. Yet he was as gentle with the people as a mother with a child. He could ask big things of the people because he did big things for them. In our gospel passage this weekend, Jesus condemned the religious leaders of his day for their hypocrisy and deceitfulness. They demanded of the people things they would not do themselves. They loved their status as leaders but failed in their duties. Behind their holy appearance they cared only for themselves. In the midst of worldwide economic instability and international political crises we look for strong and effective leadership. Where are those with the character and the courage to speak the truth and seek justice? How do we know which leaders can be trusted to deliver on their promises? How are we to hold our leaders responsible? Leaders are necessary and there is certainly nothing wrong with being one. There is the risk, however, that leaders will mishandle the authority invested in them and betray the trust of the people they serve. People seem less and less inclined to run the risks of high-profile leadership positions. The insatiable media devours careers, reputations, and families without remorse. Competitors are ruthless, believing that winning justifies anything and everything. Leaders attract attention, which makes them easy targets, and they cannot both hide and lead. Even in the first century Jesus felt it necessary to withdraw from the crowds for moment of privacy. More than ever, it seems, our leaders have to be people of conviction, convinced that what they are doing is worth the risks.

Silver Rose Prayer Service

All members of the community are encouraged to join our Knights of Columbus, Council 3743 at St. Aloysius Catholic Church on Monday, November 6, 2023 at 5:30 PM for a Rosary Prayer Service. Make plans for you and your family to attend.

The journey of the silver rose begins each year in March and ends December 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Every stop the Silver Rose makes throughout the pilgrimage is a Rosary-centered occasion for Knights, parishioners and community members to pray for respect for life. The Silver Rose program demonstrates the unity between Knights of Columbus in Canada, the United States and Mexico, through a series of prayer services promoting the dignity of all human life and honoring Our Lady.

The Silver Rose Program began in 1960, when the first rose – a real, live one – was blessed by a bishop in Ontario. The rose then traveled to New York and then to Texas where it was taken across the border into Mexico. The rose ended its pilgrimage at the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe in Monterrey on Dec. 12, the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. To better ensure future annual trips, a silver rose was ultimately made. Today, due to the popularity of the program throughout the North American continent, eight silver roses travel unique routes. 


Is Stephen Ministry Calling You?




