



Our Challenge

Dear friends:

Peter was a typical Jew of his time in believing that God's election of Israel meant that salvation was limited to Jews. He was overwhelmed to discover that God's love has a universal range, including even Gentiles. He is learning to love as Jesus loved when he goes to the house of Cornelius and indicates that he and the Roman centurion are both the objects of God's love. The Christian obligation to love others rests on the very nature of God. Jesus loved all people, not merely those with whom he shared a racial or religious identification. He also loved both the religiously righteous and the spiritually unclean. John implies that the clearest



indication of God's accepting love is that he sent his Son so each of us might be forgiven and experience new life. The word "commandment" makes us think of rigid rules and heavy obligations. Jesus says that his commandments are not to be a burden to us but a source of joy. Loving God means doing God's will, and loving other people means seeking their good. Love is self-giving, and there is no greater love than the giving of one's own life for another. God is love. Here is a definition of love so simple that a child can remember it. It might seem questionable to put the complex subject of love on a level with God. But it is completely appropriate. Can you come up with a better definition? William Temple wrote that "love cannot be defined; it can only be named." (Christus Veritas) Love is, first and last, personal. The test of true love is how much of another self there is in it. Jesus made it clear that orthodox belief is of little value if it is not supported by a life of love. The true children of God are those who express their love for God in acts of compassion toward other people. "Speaking of myself, and perhaps for some other alumni of the slums," wrote Sam Levenson, "I must declare that I was not a poor child; I just didn't have any money." (You Don't Have to Be in Who's Who to Know What's What) He then described his loving and supportive family that gave him high ideals and taught him the importance of caring for others. Loving children has less to do with showering them with the external benefits of economic prosperity than with providing them the inner security of knowing they are valued for themselves. The ultimate tests of true love, in any relationship, are essentially spiritual.
