





Our Challenge

Dear friends:

In this weekend's first reading from the Book of Job, his story provides no simple answers to the mystery of human suffering. It is a grim example of how dark and difficult life can be when God is not a part of the picture. Job's friends blame him for his sufferings. Job's wife advises him to curse God and die. If nothing else, Job endures. In our second reading from St. Paul's first letter back to the earliest Christian Church in Corinth, Greece, he points them to the unusual nature of life in



Christ. He uses himself as an example of how life is turned upside down, or how we offer ourselves freely to people in need, and of how we use the power of weakness as a way of identifying with any who are needy. In our passage from the beginning of Mark's Gospel we see Jesus avoiding the spotlight by urging those he heals to tell no one about it. It would have been easy to become known only as a healer and miracle worker. Jesus' primary purpose, however, was to proclaim the coming kingdom of God. Back in the days of the epic musical Jesus Christ, Superstar, many who loved it, kept its music alive, and made it a commercial success—but missed the point. The point has always been that, while we want a Superstar Jesus, as they did in the first century, Jesus will not cooperate. It is not enough that we are disciples of Jesus. We must follow the Jesus of the Gospels. Does the Church always follow Jesus? If the Church follows Jesus, it will be different from the world. Where Jesus said no, the Church will say no. Where Jesus said yes, the Church will say yes. When the Church is true to its Lord, it thinks differently from the world. In the world, whatever is needed to achieve a desired end is justified. Coercion, repression, deception, and violence are often used to get things done in the world. But the Church is held to a higher standard, where there is a necessary compatibility between means and ends. The Church cannot use instruments of control to achieve the goal of freedom. The Church cannot use self-centered means to achieve the goal of love.





To the Lay Faithful of the Diocese of Baton Rouge:

The annual retreat for priests of the Diocese of Baton Rouge will be 05-08 February 2024 at Manresa House of Retreats in Convent. These days of prayer and contemplation represent an important occasion for their renewal and growth in spiritual formation and well-being. As such, participation by our active priests is mandatory.

Thus, their temporary absence during this period of retreat will affect certain regular pastoral ministries. In particular, the schedule of weekday Masses and possible times for funeral Masses may be impacted and adjusted in your parish to meet needs of our priests during this time of renewal. While I recognize that this is a sacrifice, I consider this a sacrifice worth making. Deacons can provide needed funeral rites (the Wake Service, a Funeral without Mass, and the Rite of Committal). If the local parish staff is unable to secure a deacon for funeral needs, the parish staff may call the Office of the Vicar General by dialing 225.387.0561 for further assistance.

Thank you for understanding and supporting our priests with their ongoing formation and renewal for ministry! Please pray for our priests and our diocese during these days. I appreciate your affirmation and encouragement of our priests who give their lives for our diocese. May God be generous in leading us into a future filled with hope.




