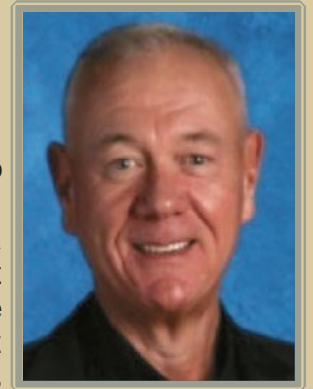

Our Challenge

Dear friends:

Following Pentecost, Jesus' followers demonstrated profound unity. Devoted to one another, and to the welfare of all, they pooled their resources in an expression of commonality. Threats to this unity would come later, but initially they were a model Christian fellowship. In our second reading this weekend, the youngest apostle, St. John, declares that faith is *"the victory that overcomes the world."* He also makes it clear that the primary evidence of such faith is love. The most appropriate witness to the reality of God is our love for one another. This proves that we love God. Love fulfills all the demands of the law. This weekend's gospel passage, also from St. John, reflects that the disciple Thomas had walked with Jesus and had seen his miraculous deeds firsthand. Still, being wise and practical, he needed the evidence the other disciples already had. The presence of Thomas in the passion narratives reassures us that we cannot be blamed for having doubts. In matters of faith we tend to see doubt as exclusively negative. Doubting Thomas is a pejorative reference. In most other matters, however, we consider doubt to be valuable and even necessary. Can you imagine believing everything you hear? Doubt is useful in faith, as well. Naïve and gullible belief is a tragic watering down of faith. While it is not uncommon for people to doubt something as extraordinary as the resurrection, there is no reason to question the importance and the benefits of loving and serving one another. History has done Thomas a disservice by associating him exclusively with doubting. It is not as if all of the disciples were given the same evidence at the same time, yet he alone had doubts about it. Thomas was not present, and who of us would not have been skeptical about such an incredible report? Great harm has resulted from people's gullibility and ready acceptance of someone's far-fetched claim. The Christian faith has not been well-served by those who have uncritically accepted outlandish reports of the supernatural and the miraculous. Perhaps we should call him Prudent Thomas.

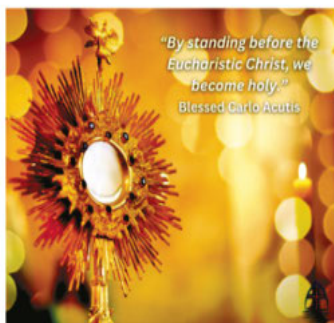
(The hope is we will all grow closer to Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist.)

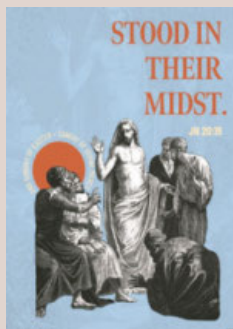

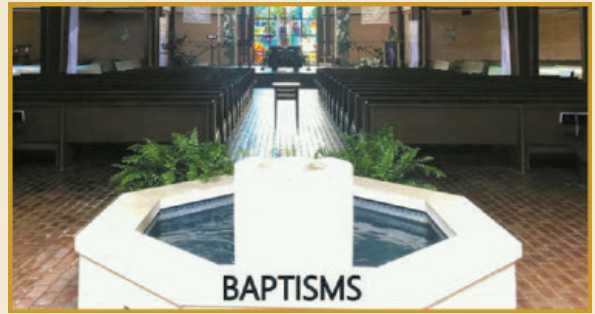

Little Flowers Girls Club is a Catholic club for girls ages 5 and up that teaches virtues through

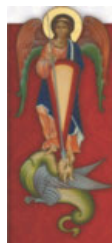
