### **Our Challenge**

### Dear friends:

From this weekend's first reading from the Book of Leviticus we are reminded that the word "leprosy" struck fear in the hearts of our biblical ancestors. Not only was it considered incurable, it was thought to be so contagious that lepers were forced to live in isolation from the rest of the community, including their own families. In our second reading from St. Paul's first letter to the Church he had established in Corinth, Greece, he sets a high standard for them. His teaching was that

everything in a person's life should be done in such a way as to bring glory to God. He was sensitive to the feeling and convictions of others, and was an example of what it meant to seek the good of all. In our passage from St. Mark's gospel, we're told that for Jesus to heal a leper would have been astounding to his public, and He healed him out of pure compassion and not to call attention to himself. We should do the good things we do solely for the sake of those we are trying to help, otherwise we are not following the example of Jesus. Emotion is a natural part of our humanity. Try to imagine an unemotional human race! Emotion adds spice, energy, and fire to our living. The problem, of course, is that emotions can only be trusted so far. If we take an inventory, we will discover that emotion has contributed to the best things and the worst things we have done. Our emotions sometimes move us to do the right thing. We cannot depend on our emotions, however. Followers of Christ must establish priorities in advance, and quite apart from emotional situations. How much emotion should there be in religious faith? Imagine how many different answers there might be to this question just among people you know! Since different people would respond differently to this question, there can only be one comprehensive answer: There should be as much emotion in your religious faith as there is genuinely in you. It is important that we neither deny our feelings nor pretend to conjure up false emotions. How we choose to express our emotions is a different matter. But God loves us as we are, therefore we should be honest emotionally.




