

Our Challenge

Dear friends:

"Resplendent and unfading is wisdom," exults the inspired writer of the Book of Wisdom. Wisdom is personified as a woman because the Jewish mystical tradition saw wisdom as the feminine aspect of God. Wisdom greets us like the rising sun when we watch for her. She comes to those who are consciously seeking truth and goodness. In our second reading this weekend, St. Paul is writing to the earliest Christians in Thessolonika, Greece. While Paul and the first Christians



were mistaken in thinking that Christ's return was on the immediate horizon, the truth is that we are always dealing with a limited portion of time. There is great wisdom in knowing this and in living with the end in view. The great Christian affirmation, however, is that death holds no power over our future because God raised Jesus from the dead. In this weekend's gospel passage, Jesus' story about the bridesmaids is intended to encourage us to be prepared for the coming of the kingdom of God. The wise bridesmaids took precautions in case the groom came late. They prepared enough oil to last through the night. Therefore, they were not left out in the cold when the wedding party arrived later than expected. "If mortals die, will they live again?" (Job 14:14) The questions about death are endless. The one undisputable fact is that death is certain. The hospice movement and the many studies of death and dying provide helpful insights concerning the end of life. More than human wisdom is needed, however, when we are actually approaching death. Our hope is in the One through whom death has been conquered. Despite the pain and grief it brings, death has positive significance in the midst of life. The Christian perspective on death involves a daily process of "dying with Christ." As we receive more and more of God's presence in our lives, the more we relinquish those things that are deadly in our daily living. Welton Gaddy has suggested that it is no insignificant thing that the resurrection of Jesus occurred "after three days." Why did the resurrection have to wait? Why did God not demonstrate his power more quickly? Why did the resurrection take place after everybody had long since dispersed? Because our faith is victorious, but not without suffering. Three days of grieving are as much a part of our experience as resurrection. Victory is not always immediate even when it is certain.






