



## **Our Challenge**

#### Dear friends:

In the Acts of the Apostles, St. Peter tells us that the strongest argument for Christ's resurrection is the life that he lived. Given the strength of his preaching, his mighty works, and his miraculous healings, how could death have the last word? The resurrection is God's vindication of Jesus' holy life. We share both in Jesus' death and resurrection. This means we have been raised with Christ from death to life. Therefore, we should focus on spiritual realities, on higher things. Resurrection is not only what awaits us at the end of our earthly lives, it is the



power by which we live for Christ day by day. Some say a planetarium is better than a street map if you really want to see where you live. At Easter, without a planetarium, we are invited to view reality in a larger frame of reference. If your life is being diminished by stressful situations and mundane obligations, there is a larger world for you to inhabit. It is the realm of the spirit. The dominant emotion of the first Easter was surprise. Biblical promises have primarily to do with redemption and rebirth. They invariable foresee the triumphant of life over death. Christ's resurrection fulfills God's promise. It is interesting how often we think we are at the end of something, but it turns out to be the beginning of something else. Easter is not the end of the story of Jesus Christ, but only the end of the beginning. Luke's Gospel ends with Jesus' resurrection and ascension. But Luke continues the story. Luke also wrote Acts - - The Acts of the Apostles. The resurrection was one triumph of Jesus Christ. Another awaits, the universal triumph of Christ's people, Christ's kingdom, Christ as Alpha and Omega.

## The Eucharistic Revival... What is it?

A Pew survey found only 31% of Catholics believe the Eucharist is the Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Our Lord, Jesus Christ.

To address this, the Bishops of America set out on a three year plan to teach the faithful about the Eucharist. We are in year two, culminating in a **National Eucharistic Congress** in Indianapolis July 17 - 21, 2024. The hope is we will all grow closer to Our Lord in the Holy Eucharist.

The Holy Eucharist will go on a pilgrimage through 4 routes crisscrossing the United States; the Holy Eucharist will come to St. Joseph's Cathedral in Baton Rouge on June 6 - 7, 2024.

On August 14 - 15, 2024, the Host will travel down the Mississippi in an 80' tall Monstrance from Baton Rouge to New Orleans during the Fête-Dieu du Mississippi. Let us all go out to meet Our Lord as he traverses our country!


