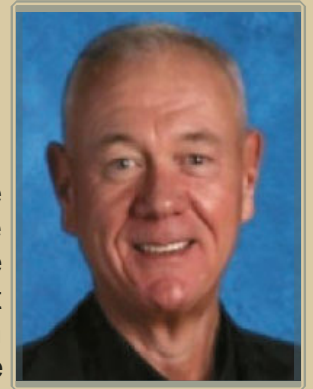

Our Challenge

Dear friends,

In this weekend's first reading the prophet Isaiah reminds us that God created the world for our benefit. The cycles of the seasons and the fertility of the fields are perpetual reminders that this is our Father's world. As God's children, we are privileged to enjoy it. In our second reading, St Paul is still writing to the earliest Christians in Rome who are enduring times of privation and persecution. Such things are the common lot of all humankind. For Christ's followers, however, there is a glory in the future that will more than compensate for their hardship. Jesus was realistic about the fact that many people would not respond to the word of God. There were different reasons for this. We are to hear God's word with the ears of the heart, just as the good soil receives and nourishes the scattered seed. Hearing, like most things human, is a great mystery. The fact that there is a sound is no guarantee it will be heard. We tend to hear what we want to hear, as the prophets of Israel knew well. Even God cannot assume that everyone is listening. The prophetic word begins, "Hear, O Israel!" But as often as not, the people do not hear. We cannot overestimate the power of the spoken word. Both good news and bad news are heard in the heart. The familiar sound of a loved one's voice can work miracles. The thoughtless words of an adult can crush a child's ego. Words of encouragement can make a world of difference, as can hopeless words. Being bombarded by a million voices a day, and perhaps too many ill-chosen words of our own, it is understandable if we devalue words. Yet nothing is more central to our faith than the "word." In the beginning was the Word. Through the Word a world was called into being. Jesus Christ is the Word made flesh. The word of God is alive and active. It cuts more keenly than any two-edged sword, piercing as far as the place where life and spirit, joints and marrow, divide." (Hebrews 4:12)

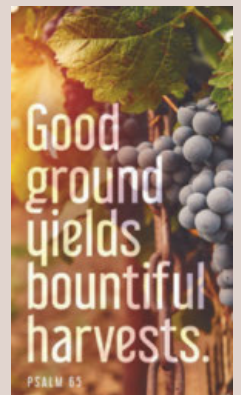

Grief Support Series Begins in the Fall

The St. Aloysius Stephen Ministry is sponsoring a 10-week grief support book series study written by Dr. Alan Wolfelt, which launches in September with a series of ten morning sessions offered.

Dr. Wolfelt, Director of the Center for Loss and Life's Transition®, writes about grief in one of his many Books, "Mourning in our culture isn't always easy. Normal thoughts and feelings connected to loss are typically seen as unnecessary and even shameful. Instead of encouraging mourners to express themselves, our culture's unstated rules would have them avoid their hurt and 'be strong.' But grief is not a disease. Instead, it's the normal, healthy process of embracing the mystery of the death of someone loved. If mourners see themselves as active participants in their healing, they will experience a renewed sense of meaning and purpose in life."

Morning Grief Support sessions begin on **Wednesday, September 6th from 9:00 -10:30 AM in the PSC Conference Room, and continue every Wednesday, Sept. 13th, 20th, 27th, Oct. 4th, 11th, 18th, 25th, Nov. 1st, 8th and 15th. The cost of the materials is \$25.00 which includes the book and journal.** The support group will be led by Dana Territo, Stephen Ministry Leader, who has been trained at the Alan Wolfelt Loss and Transition Center in Colorado, as well as facilitated by other Stephen Ministry members, too. MISSION APPEAL AT ST. ALOYSIUS PARISH AUGUST 12th & 13th (All Masses)

Every year the Diocese of Baton Rouge invites deserving missionaries to be involved in the Missionary Cooperative Plan. This year Fr. Steve Rodrigues (*a Franciscan Capuchin from south India*) will make an appeal so that the Capuchin Franciscan mission can continue in India.

A Capuchin Franciscan Order is a legitimate branch of the Order of Friars Minor founded by St. Francis of Assisi and dedicated to preaching and missionary work. We are known worldwide for our zeal to reach out to the unreached and to spread faith. A Franciscan is a brother to all. He is approachable, peacemaker, simple, humble and concerned about others. A Capuchin is a man of the church and St. Francis insisted that his brothers be "*thoroughly Catholic*" so that they contribute to the sanctification of the Church. *Our Christian Identity is one of being missionary.*

Our Ministries: Following the example of St. Francis of Assisi, Capuchins give priority to two ministries: working with the poor and preaching the Word of God. Under these two descriptions fall a variety of ministries that further the dream of St. Francis: serving in prisons, homeless shelters, dispensaries, elderly, youth ministry, taking care of orphans, retreat centers, looking after poor parishes, free medical care for the poor, etc. We humbly request you to generously support us in these ministries.

We have a special charism for working with the poor, orphans, neglected and the forgotten; and taking those assignments which others refuse. The special collection from all the weekend Masses August 12th and 13th, will go to take care of the following projects:

To construct 7 classrooms for the education of the slow learners of the remote village (children and adults).

Feeding, sustaining, educating and other basic facilities for 75 boys in a poor village.

Renovation of the Boarding building and school for the underprivileged, migrants, street children etc. The building is in a bad shape and needs urgent attention.

To help around 50 young children who have lost both of their parents due to Covid-19.

To construct a community hall: to give free medical aid for the poor; and to give education to children, women and men in remote villages.

We are financially very weak and to carry forward our mission we depend on the providence of God, and on your generous and benevolent help. Thank you for your willingness to support us in our mission. Do pray and bless us. God bless you abundantly for your generosity and sacrifices. "Be a rainbow in someone's cloud". **'God loves a cheerful giver.'** The poor children will pray for you. God bless you!

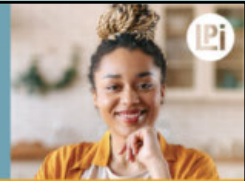


