

Our Challenge

Dear friends,

God's timetable is not our timetable. We want to see the fulfillment of God's promises immediately, if not sooner! But God's purposes unfold throughout our lifetimes and across centuries. Someday we will all share in the glory of God's kingdom. The resurrection of Christ is the promise that we will share in God's triumph over sin and death. God is not limited by time or space. God is certainly not restricted to the span of our years on this earth in establishing the eternal kingdom and fulfilling the divine will. Sometimes our waiting for God to act or to respond seems to take far too long. We grow restless and weary. We begin to



despair and think of giving up hope. This is natural. But those who wait patiently for the Lord will never be disappointed. "Fools rush in where angels fear to tread." This familiar sentence can be interpreted in several different ways. It can be a warning against taking holy things for granted. Or it can be a reminder to tread cautiously when you are on dangerous grounds. But it can also be encouragement to be patient while waiting for God's will to be revealed. Waiting can be the most difficult thing in the world. This is especially true in an age where more and more things are "instant." Often it takes more faith to wait than it does to act. There is a line from the poet Robert Frost about "waiting for the water to clear" that captures the importance of patience. Usually the time spent in waiting is more than repaid when we see our way more clearly than we would have if we had plunged blindly ahead. Waiting for the water to clear is a mark of wisdom and an act of faith.

The St. Aloysius Stephen Ministry will host a Lenten Prayer Service "Broken, Burdened, and Blessed" on Tuesday, March 28, 2023 at 6:30 PM in the church.

Jesus said to her, "Give me a drink." The Samaritan woman said to him, "How can you, a Jew, ask me, a Samaritan woman, for a drink?" Jesus answered and said to her, "If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you, 'Give me a drink,' you would have asked him and he would have given you living water." (John 4: 7-10)

The story of the Samaritan Woman at the Well illustrates our feelings of brokenness and feeling burdened. Yet, it ends with a blessing. The Samaritan woman is broken, unmarried and goes to the well at noon, so as to not be seen or scorned by the other women. Jesus, broken with fatigue, reaches out to her, striving to heal her brokenness and to lift her burdens. The Samaritan Woman soon realizes Jesus was the Messiah and she goes to spread the word in the village.

In this story, the meeting between Jesus and the unnamed woman offers a symbolic image of the Lenten season, our journey, and the invitation it extends to us - the invitation to be open when our "wells" run dry, when they are broken and burdened from our daily journey of life and living. And from that opening, we may suddenly find ourselves in this Lenten season drenched in the grace and love of God that reveals a blessing never imagined.

This special candle lighting ceremony on Tuesday offers thoughtful prayer and contemplation as we unearth our brokenness, embracing it as we move toward the cross and the empty tomb.


