Our Challenge

Dear friends,

From the Book of Exodus, we have this weekend a dramatic picture of faith. When Joshua went into battle, Moses promised to pray continually. Arms upraised, Moses prayed, and the battle went well. But when Moses' arms grew weary, others had to provide strength and support. Because they did not lose heart the battle was won. In our second reading this weekend from St. Paul's letter to the bishop Timothy, Paul urged Timothy to be faithful in all situations and

conditions. This involved prayer, honoring his calling, and standing firm on the scriptures. This is not always easy. Christians of all times and places are called to remain faithful to what they have learned and believed. Jesus' parable of the dishonest judge and persistent widow in this weekend's gospel passage does not represent God as an insensitive, uncaring official who has to be badgered to give us what we want. Rather, it commends the persistence of the woman, and sees her as an example of the kind of faith that never loses heart. The "Word" of God has more than one meaning. John's Gospel says it was through God's Word that all things were created. John also says Jesus was the Word made flesh. While the Bible was not dictated by God, Christians have always considered it to be divinely inspired. In it we have a unique written expression of the truth of God. Timothy was young, but promising as a potential leader in the growing Christian community. Paul encourages him by helping him recall the many positive influences and examples that have already blessed him. The Scriptures and the Spirit are especially important in the development of young Christians. The Bible has been called "the book nobody knows." Sadly, many people who seldom read the Bible claim to believe it is both a unique book and one that is divinely inspired. This obvious inconsistency may be best understood by those who have actually, and earnestly, tried to read the Bible. Compared to contemporary forms of communication, it is a difficult book. The Bible belongs to the Christian community, as the ancient scriptures belonged to the people of Israel. It is best heard, learned, and understood within the community of faith.



If you page through Paul's first letter to the Corinthians, you will see that he addresses many of the same topics that appear in the news headlines today: scandals, promiscuity, debates and controversies, and issues related to prosperity versus poverty. Clearly, the struggles faced by the early Christians are in many ways similar to our own. Paul's messages to the Corinthians about divisions, immorality,

persecution, and other trials offer much needed wisdom for our own times.

First Corinthians: The Church and the Christian Community explores the key elements of the gospel message that Paul introduced to a new and growing Church. Presenter Tim Gray examines Paul's advice for living an authentic Christian life in a pagan culture as well as his teachings about the nature of grace, the Church as the Body of Christ, and the most powerful gift of all—the Eucharist.




