Children's Church is a great opportunity for adults and middle school/high school youth to volunteer and help eager youngsters learn the Word of the Lord. Children's Church is an age-appropriate Liturgy of the Word offered for children in PreK through 2nd grade at most 9:00 AM and 11:00 AM Masses. No pre-registration is necessary. All children are welcome and encouraged to attend. Just before the Liturgy of the Word begins for the assembly, the celebrant will invite the children to gather at the altar, receive a blessing, and then follow the catechist from the church to the school cafeteria. During this special time, the volunteers will lead the children through prayers, songs and readings that are simplified for children. The children will learn about the same scripture readings as the rest of the assembly. They will be taught a simplified main message of the readings and are encouraged to share that message with their parents after Mass. The children will return to Mass to sit with their families just before the consecration.

Our Challenge

Dear friends:

The prophet Jeremiah lived centuries before Christ, but he knew all about living a sacrificial life. He suffered for his faithfulness to God. He was mocked for his convictions. He paid a heavy price for taking a stand against evil and error. The apostle Paul couldn't have been clearer about what it means to be a follower of Christ. Being a Christian means committing ourselves to be a living sacrifice! The idea of a living sacrifice is crucial. We are to live as Christ died - - for others. The

disciples of Jesus were not prepared for his death on the cross, even though he tried to prepare them. They could not imagine that serving God might mean dying on a cross. But faith in God demands such self-giving, sacrificial love. The cross is more than a reminder that Christ died for us. It is the pattern of how we are to live in the world. Being a follower of Christ means putting the needs of others ahead of our own comfort. It means taking the suffering of others on ourselves to set them free. Being a Christian means living the cross as well as loving it. Each of our scripture lessons presents a disturbing challenge to Christ's people. We are reminded that God has called us to be Christ-like, and this call demands nothing less than the total gift of ourselves. The Christian faith can be properly described as the "cruciform life." The Christian reaches out right and left to those across the political spectrum in common cause for justice. The Christian reaches up and down to those on the pilgrimage of faith in common commitment to truth. Each time we make the sign of the cross we are describing the demands of our faith and the shape of our discipleship.

Celebrating Sunday for Catholic Families






