Our Challenge

Dear friends:

Our Old Testament passage this weekend from the Book of Job underscores the truth that---in essentially every gathering of people---there are the trustworthy and the untrustworthy. The disciple Judas proved to have a evil heart and lost his place among the disciples by betraying Jesus. Matthias, on the other hand, was a healthy and conscientious individual who became an apostle of Christ. The hallmark of



being a Christian is self-giving love. This is clear in 1 John 4. This means that the true Christian will always be characterized by a caring attitude toward others and a compassionate spirit. On the other hand, the ways of the world are the antithesis of true love. The world has never been ready for someone like Jesus, who put principle above expediency, honesty above deceit, and generosity above selfishness. All those who truly followed him would be out of step with the world. The uniqueness of Jesus was as much in his character as a human as it was in his oneness with the divine. The Chinese word for "crisis" is made up of two different symbols. One of the symbols means "danger," and the other means "opportunity." Consider how often unique opportunities are found in what seem to be dangerous circumstances. For the Christian, every crisis is a time of possible danger, but it is also an opportunity to discover the promises of Christ in our lives. No one has the luxury of a perennially smooth, serene voyage through this life. The skies darken and the winds howl sooner or later for all the sons and daughters of earth. A legend tells of a castle on the Rhine River long ago where the fierce winds blew and the thrashing storms raged. One day the nobleman who lived in the castle strung huge wires from crag to crag and from turret to turret. When the gales came, as they always did, it is said that this giant harp made music in the storm.

The solemn flotilla will embark on the Mighty Mississippi for a one-time only Blessing of the River and the Great State of Lousiana! Families, businesses and churches are encouraged to "come down to the river" and participate in the two-day blessing. The extraordinary procession will begin on Wednesday, August 14 at 8 AM with a Votive Mass of the Holy Eucharist by Baton Rouge Bishop Michael Duca at St. Joseph's Cathedral in Baton Rouge. Following the Mass there will be a procession with the Blessed Sacrament to the Mississippi River where the 130-mile procession and blessing will commence. At 10:30 AM the flotilla will depart. The boat procession will pass Plaquemine at about 12:35 PM and Donaldsonville at approximately 3:50 PM. The flotilla is slated to arrive at Convent, LA at about 5:40 PM where there will be a procession to the historic St. Michael Church for all-night adoration. On Thursday, August 15 at 8:45 AM there will be a procession from St. Michael's back to the river dock and at 10:00 AM the boats will depart for New Orleans. The procession will pass Reserve at about 12:00 PM, Luling at about 1:40 PM, and Audubon Park at about 3:40 PM. Families, parishes, and pilgrims are encouraged to

gather at these revival sites along the river for prayer and reception of the blessing. The flotilla will arrive at about **4:25 PM** in the French Quarter and there will be a Great Benediction on the levee at **5:15 PM** in front of Jackson Square, followed by a procession into St. Louis Cathedral for a final blessing and a Solemn Mass of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary by Archbishop Gregory Aymond, D.D. The two-day festivities will conclude with a celebration in Jackson Square at **7:30 PM**. All are encouraged to "Come Down to the River" for this historic event!
