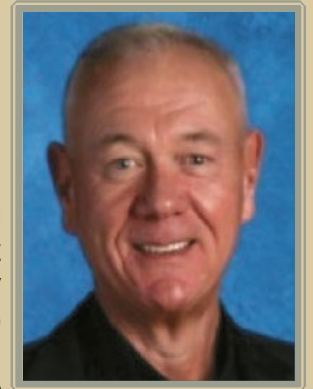

Our Challenge

Dear friends:

God expects us to follow high standards of conduct. However, when we fail to hold to these high standards, he is ready to forgive us and help restore us to a right relationship with him and with all humanity. Instead of holding others to arbitrary human standards of fairness, St. Paul put his faith in God. He did not hold God to the standards of the day, but he realized that God has his own way of looking at all of humanity. The parable Jesus told in this weekend's gospel passage shows the generosity of God. We try to "level the playing field" by establishing rules that supposedly treat everyone equally. However, the reality is, this system discriminates against those who do not have certain advantages. God knows us through and through. His generosity deals with our limitations as well as our advantages. We have heard it said from the Old Testament, "An eye for an eye and tooth for a tooth". This was the dictum of fairness as expressed by certain laws of that period in the Old Testament. But Jesus' says: "Do good", "love those who hate you" for rich will be your reward in my Father's kingdom. God is not bound by our ideas of fairness. His generosity goes beyond our limited vision of fairness. We usually do not get what we deserve. We receive God's goodness that is far beyond anything we actually deserve. We give thanks to God that he does not give us what we deserve, but gives to us out of his great generosity. God has bound us together in a common life. As we try to struggle for our own justice and truth we need to confront one another without hatred or bitterness. We need to work together with mutual forbearance and respect. In this way we honor God and his goodness to us.

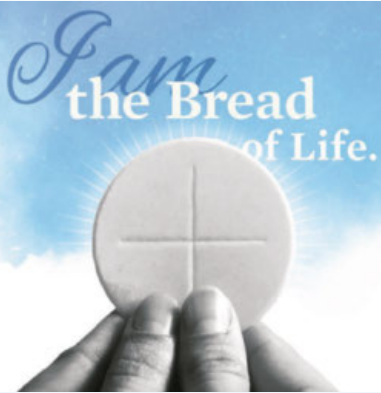

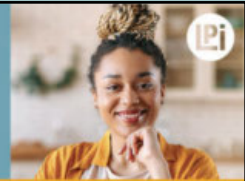


