Our Challenge

Dear friends,

In this weekend's Old Testament passage from the First Book of Samuel, we hear that Samuel was just like the rest of us. He tended to judge people by outward appearances. Samuel wanted to crown one of the tall sons of Jesse. But God had chosen little David. Samuel learned a valuable lesson. He learned to look into the human heart when seeking the will of God. This weekend's New Testament passage from the letter to the Ephesians begs the question, what does it mean to live as "children of the light?" Lights are made to shine in dark places. To be a child of the light means to carry the warmth of Christ to those who are left out in the cold. To bring the wisdom of Christ to those who are



stumbling in the dark. In this weekend's gospel passage, the blind man who was healed wasn't worried about the theological or moral credentials of Jesus. He didn't ask whether his methods were orthodox. The only thing that mattered was that Jesus restored his sight. Lending a helping hand is all that matters when people are in need. How do we respond to persons in great need? One response is to discover the cause of the problem. A second response is to find the possible culprit behind the cause. A third response is to find a solution to the problem. All of these responses have their place, but only the last one matters if you are the person in need. We spend more time analyzing human needs than we do solving human problems. It is more comfortable to set up task forces to study problems than to send out work forces to change society. The problems facing our world and country are staggering. Where do we begin in solving problems of hunger, disease, poverty, prejudice, and violence? We are clearly losing ground in the battle against these dark forces. But we can strike a blow against these problems if we will begin to help those around us who are in need. Simple acts of kindness can pave the way for a more humane and compassionate world.






